## **Program Description: Girls' Club Mentorship Program**

A lunch hour program to create a safe space for girls who identify as girls. Girls' Club provides a safe virtual space for girls to be their full authentic selves, build their self-esteem, develop leadership skills and be inspired to make a change in their community and the world. Our 13-unit program calendar engages girls on the following subject matters & issues: bullying, healthy relationships, feminism, social activism, digital citizenship, entrepreneurship mental health awareness and innovation. This is a full school year program with two semesters: Fall & Winter. During COVID-19 this program is virtual via Wofemtech.

## **Program Facilitator Responsibilities:**

### **Role Responsibilities:**

- Assist with planning, preparation and logistics of weekly virtual sessions, including preparation of program space & resources, and creation of activities.
- Facilitate weekly session content & activities through animation, active listening and open dialogue prepared by Program Director.
- Represent The ForUsGirls Foundation values, framework and approach to create safe, encouraging and learning spaces for marginalized girls.
- Close the virtual session with notes for upcoming sessions and provide feedback on program successes and challenges to the Program Director by completing the weekly Session Feedback form.
- Communication any student issues or problems regarding their safety and well-being to school point of staff or in-school professional i.e. social worker, psychologist, or counsellor
