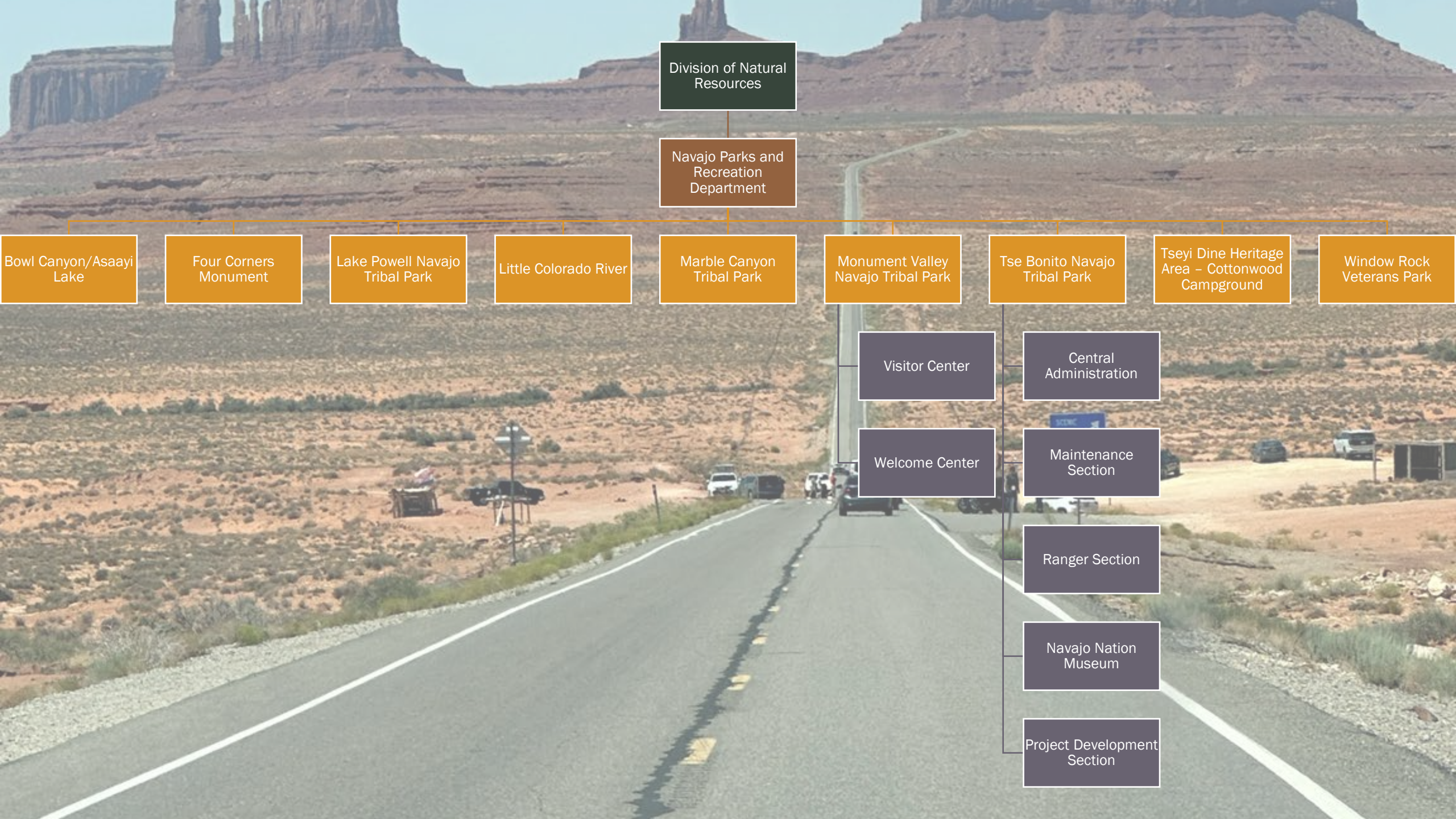

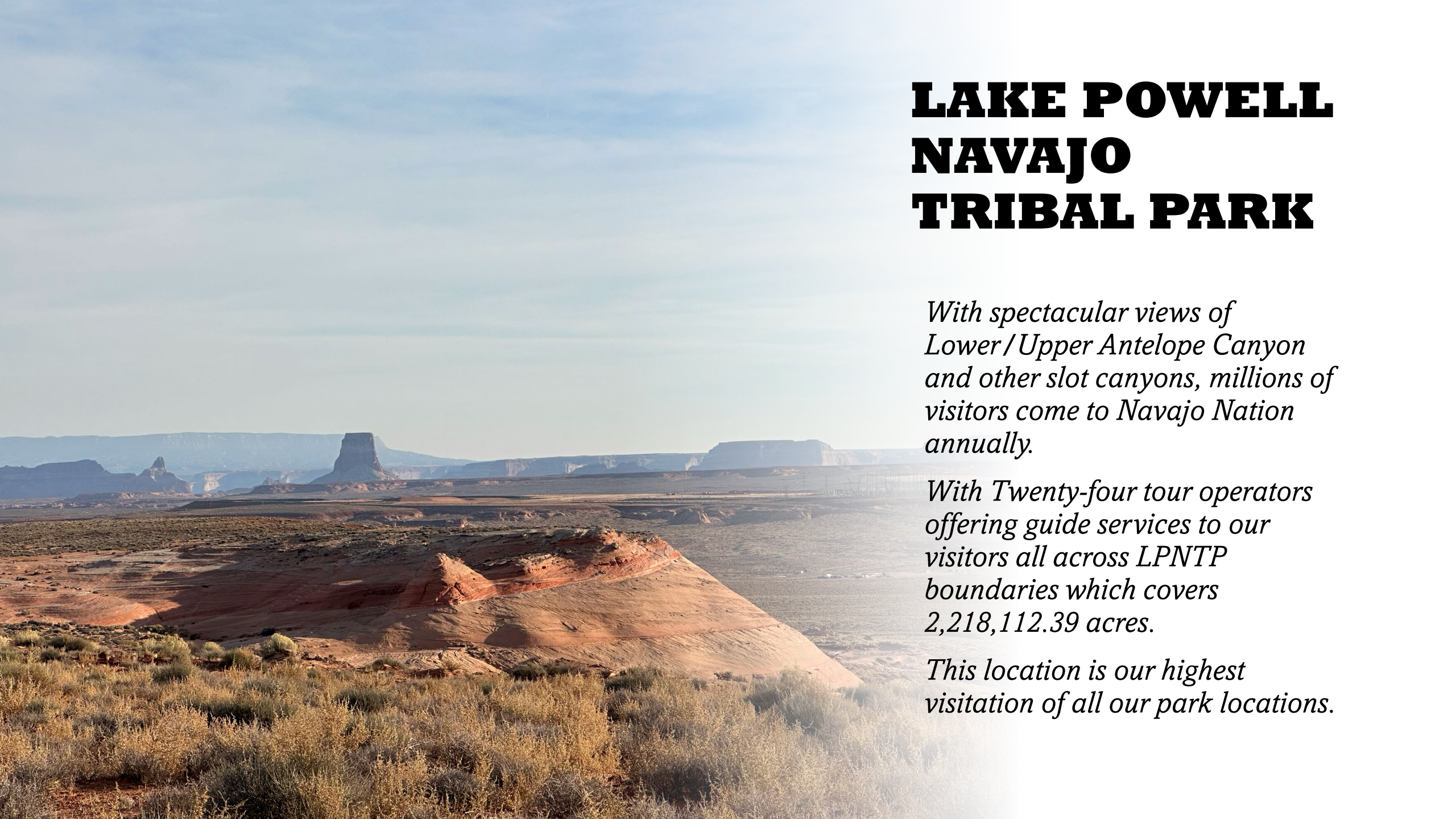
Monument Valley Navajo Tribal Park has millions of visitors from all over the world every year. With residents living in the valley and forty-seven tour operators operating within the tribal park including the number of visitors throughout the year creates congestion within the 17-mile loop and oversight of 91,696 total acreage. These conditions have a number of impacts to the access roads, vegetation, cultural sites and overall environmental impact. The shift of focus to preservation and conservation of our tribal parks involves all our stakeholders.



NPRD is working with Historic Preservation and BIA Oljato Chapter in streamlining processes and finding solutions to these and other important issues including much needed repairs and maintenance on a daily basis.







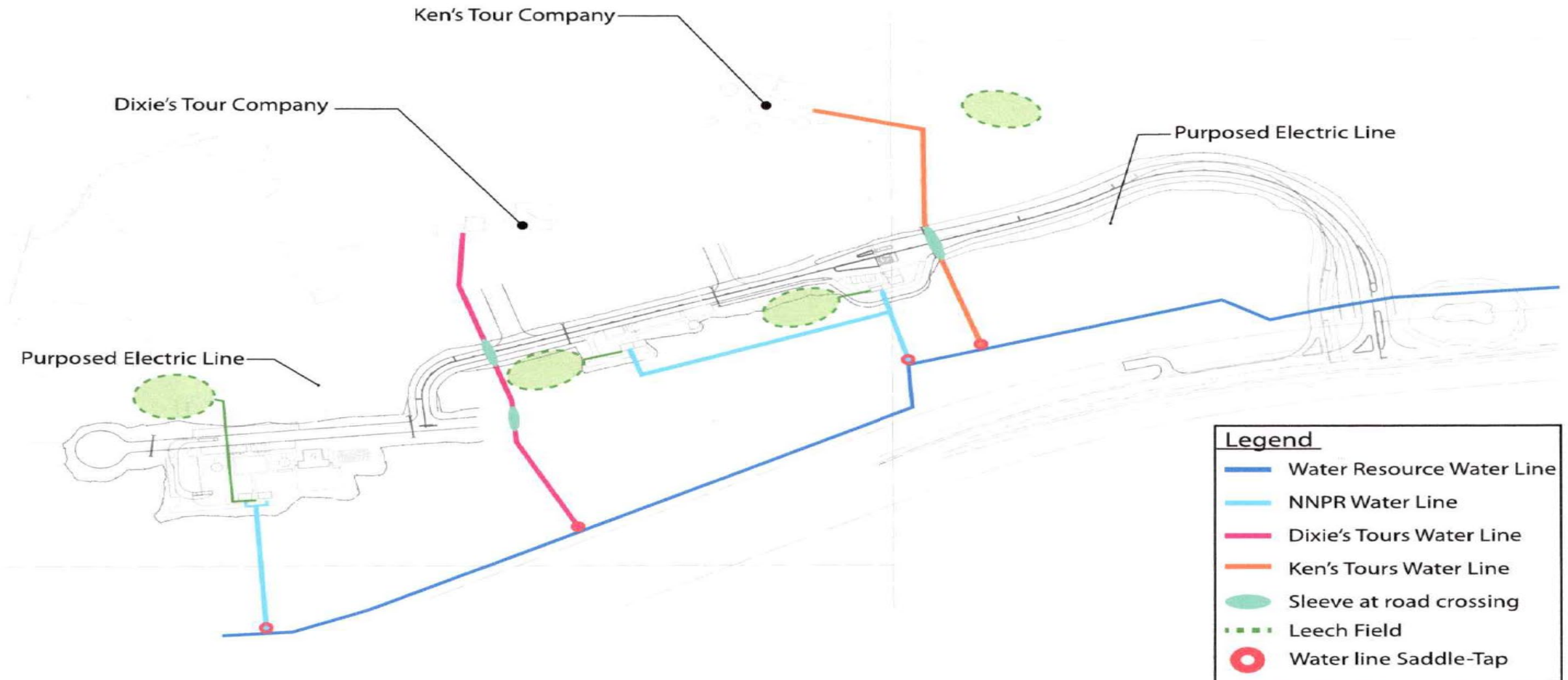
LAKE POWELL NAVAJO TRIBAL PARK

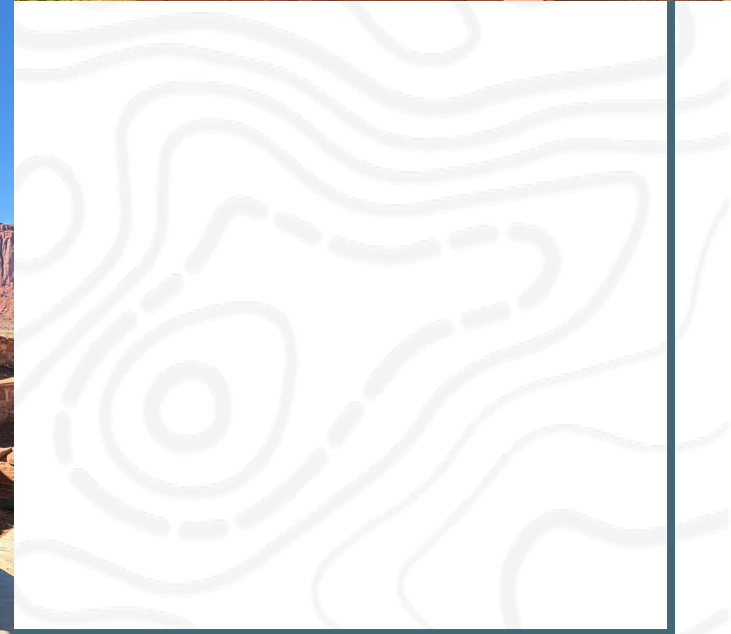

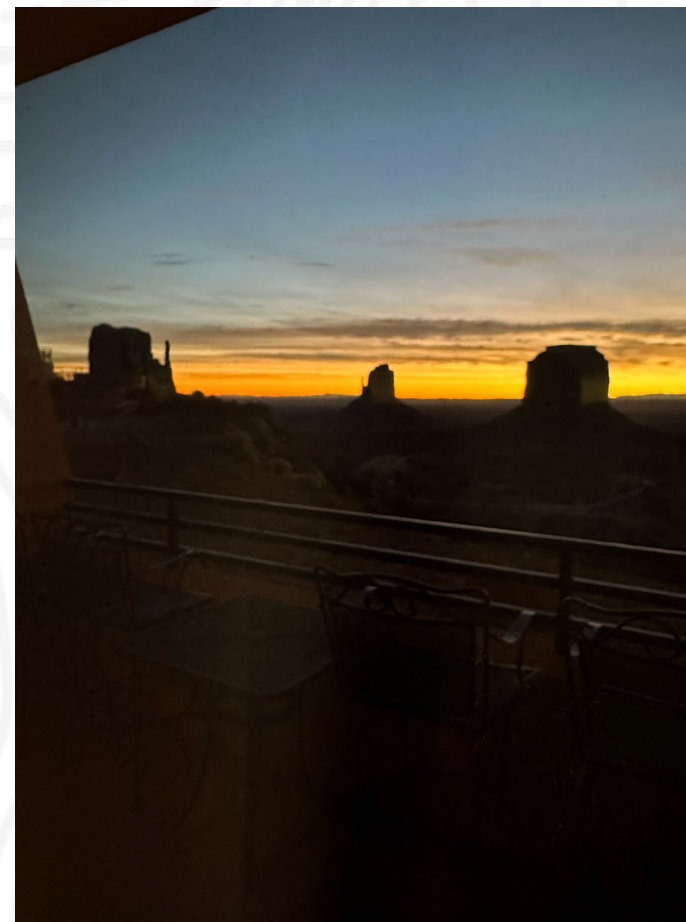
