

Richland County SCD Geology Tour 2024




- ◆ Dr. David Hopkins and Keith Anderson presenting.

Keith Anderson is a soil scientist recently retired from the Natural Resources Conservation Service. His 35-year soil mapping career began in northwest Wisconsin and concluded in the Red River Valley of the North. Other stops along the way include northern Florida and areas in eastern and western Minnesota.

David Hopkins earned a B.S. in Agricultural Science-Soils from Montana State University in 1979; and worked for the SCS in eastern Montana on the Carter and Fallon County soil survey. In 1981, Hopkins began working on intensive soil surveys for the ND Agricultural Experiment Station. His M.S. degree on sodic soils in western ND was followed by a PhD in the Sandhills, due to an interest in teaching. Hopkins taught Intro Soil Science for 14 years and has taught Soil Genesis and Survey since 2005. Since 2015, Hopkins has focused on soil micromorphology as a proxy for soil health on the benchmark Barnes soil series.
