

BERNARD BREAKSTONE DIES SUDDENLY OF HEART TROUBLE

Bernard Breakstone, aged 67, one of the best known Jewish residents of this city, died Sunday night at the Jeddo trolley station, following an attack of heart trouble.

Mr. Breakstone has for many years been a prominent business man in this city and accompanied by his son Albert went to Jeddo to inspect some old machinery at the G. B. Markle Coal Company, and while waiting at the trolley station at that place on their return home Mr. Breakstone was stricken and died before medical assistance could be secured.

Mr. Breakstone was born in Prussia and came to this country about fifty years ago settling in this city. About forty years ago he opened a fish and oyster market on Public Square, where Joseph S. Coons & Co.'s store now stands. He conducted this business for about ten years when he went to Pittston and embarked in the liquor business. About twenty years ago he returned to this city and engaged in the junk business, which he conducted himself for a time later going in business with his son-in-law, E. J. Fisher.

He is survived by one son, Albert Breakstone, of this city, and a daughter, Mrs. E. J. Fisher, of South Franklin street, and a number of grandchildren. He is survived by the following brothers: Abe, of this city; Solomon, of Chicago, and Max and Jacob, of New York. His wife died about seven months ago, and a daughter, Miss Adella Breakstone, an elocutionist of note, died a number of years ago.
