

MISS BREAKSTONE VERY LOW.

Her Friends Have Abandoned All Hope of Recovery.

Miss Adela Breakstone, the popular recitationist and professor of elocution at Wyoming Seminary, was so ill yesterday afternoon that it was feared the end was not far distant. A relapse ensued on Monday. Hope for recovery was almost abandoned.

The news of Miss Breakstone's desperate condition will bring sorrow to many friends whose sympathy has been with her during all her illness. She is but 24 years old, but her capabilities are far beyond that age, for she has been a successful teacher of physical culture and elocution for five years at Wyoming Seminary—having graduated from the Boston School of Elocution.

At the seminary she has always been wonderfully popular, and her work has been additionally effective for this very reason. Her qualities of heart and mind have compelled sincere attachments and admiration. She is the eldest child of Mr. and Mrs. B. Breakstone, of this city. These, with a sister Sadie, and brother Albert await the end with sorrow laden hearts. The ailment from which she suffered at first was pneumonia, followed by serious complications. Through four weeks of suffering she has been always patient and resigned.

REPORTED DYING.

News from the seminary last evening was as follows: "Miss Adela Breakstone, the elocutionist, aged 24 years, who has been ill for the past three weeks with congestion of the lungs, is to-night dying. Her physicians, four in number, have given up her case as hopeless. She is well known throughout northeastern Pennsylvania.
