

Chaimson Brothers And Breakstone in Pleas for Pardons

Milwaukee —(P)— E. J. Koelzer, assistant United States attorney, received notice today of application for pardons by the Chaimson brothers of Shawano, Wis., Sam, William, and Oscar, and Julian Breakstone, New London, Wis., who are under a federal court sentence of three months in the house of correction for trading in hi-jacked merchandise.

Koelzer said he would oppose the pardon, "due to the exceptional leniency shown these defendants."

They were convicted of buying goods which had been hi-jacked from trucks operating in and out of Chicago. The leaders of the hi-jacking ring, Sam Ginsberg and Louis Snyder, both of Chicago, were sentenced by Judge F. A. Geiger to serve a year in the house of correction.

Sam and Oscar Chaimson and Breakstone have served about a month of their sentences. William Chaimson was granted a stay of execution until June by Judge Geiger.
