

George Wicks Rolls 226, A New High Score Record

Some Exciting Plays in Evening
World Tourney Match, Hunts
Point Beating Broadway Ar-
cade Trio.

THE Hunts Point trio invaded the Broadway Arcade alleys last night and carried off the honors in two of the three games scheduled there. The Broadway Arcades put up their strongest game in the first session which they won. It was here that Geo. Wicks created a new high score record of 226 for The Evening World's big tourney. After the first game Freddy Dauenhauer was the only Stein man to maintain his early speed throughout the series.

The pins broke badly for Captain Breakstone and his teammates at the start, but encouraged by their host of rooters and Manager Bob Lowenthal, they grabbed the second game with ease. The final session was crowded with exciting plays. Breakstone and Wicks both tore off a three, seven and ten pin split, and the game was not decided until both anchor men had shot their last balls.

With his team but ten pins behind, and after rolling a strike in the last frame, Stuckenbrock stepped over the foul line on the next ball, losing the ten he made on that throw and at the same time giving Breakstone the opportunity to win out for his aggregation. In his final frame Breakstone only hit for seven, the five, seven and eight remaining—a difficult spare to make under ordinary circumstances. Needing a mark to win, Breakstone deliberated this important ball and made the necessary spare. Hunts Point won by three pins.
