

RADIO PRINCE IS SELECTED FOR BIG FAIR

George Breakstone, juvenile NBC artist, was chosen "Prince" of the Radio Electrical World's Fair in the final competition at the U.S. Veterans Hospital in the Bronx.

Clementine Turella and Baby Adele Kendler, both of WMCA, were chosen as "Princesses."

These children of radio will be the attendants to "Miss Radio of 1931" at the eighth annual Radio Electrical World's Fair, to be held in Madison Square Garden during the week of September 21 to 26 inclusive.

Breakstone, who is nine years old, is heard regularly on the Children's Hour every Sunday morning over an NBC-WJZ network and on the Lady Next Door program daily over an NBC-WEAF network. A native born French boy, young Breakstone does French impersonations, chief of which is that of his fellow countryman, Chevalier.
