FEB. 10.—If "to live in hearts we leave behind is not to die," then the memory of Miss Adela Breakstone who expired Thursday afternoon, will live like a sweet and cherished dream in the hearts of her friends. Miss Breakstone was the eldest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. B. Breakstone, of Madison street, and was born in New York City on Christmas eve 1871. When one year old her parents removed to this city, and with the exception of a brief residence in Pittston, she lived here continuously until her death. She was educated in the schools of the city, graduating in 1889. In the following October she entered the Emerson School of Oratory and Elocution in Boston and her superior talent attracted the attention of Dr. Emerson and other teachers. In 1892 she was employed as instructor in elocution and physical culture at Wyoming Seminary in which position she continued until death ended her career. Miss Breakstone was buried on Sunday Feb. 9, at 3 P. M. Rabbi Feuerlicht of Scranton officiating.
