

Work Started On Honor Roll

Newspapers, Data Will Be
Put Inside 10th Ward
Monument Today

Workmen yesterday started to lay bricks for the octagonal honor roll at West South and West River Streets which will carry the names of men and women from 10th Ward who are serving in the armed forces.

The honor roll, which will be of permanent character with the names of servicemen and women of the ward sandblasted at conclusion of the war, will be dedicated at exercises on Armistice Day, November 11.

Before the brick work is completed today a sealed glass bowl containing copies of Wilkes-Barre's newspapers with the list of servicemen and women so far obtained, a list of the financial committee, committee for erection of the memorial and name of the architect and general contractor will be placed inside the structure by Frank Youngblood of the committee handling last minute arrangements for construction of the honor roll.

The honor roll is being erected on a concrete base. The brick work will be six feet across at the bottom and taper off to four feet where the Greek and Cararra glass is to be placed until the sandblasting is done after the war. Names will be printed on the glass for the present. The monument will be eight feet high to be surmounted by a gilt eagle and a half globe.

Mr. Youngblood yesterday appealed for any additional names that are to be printed on the glass before the honor roll is ready for dedication. He announced that contributions toward the honor roll's erection will be received by him at 203 South Main Street.

Committee which is in charge of erection of the monument is made up of Frank J. Youngblood, Charles Weissman, Arnold Hartland, William Burkert, James McKane, Samuel Wolfe, Jr., and August Crebe. Robert Eyerman is the architect and William Amesbury is the general contractor.
