She founded a public relations firm in New York City specializing in business development for law firms before joining an economic consulting firm specializing in regulatory policy.

She is an Advisor to the Churchill Archives Centre, Churchill College, Cambridge, a member of the Board of Advisers of the International Churchill Society, a former Trustee of Wigmore Hall, the venerable chamber music venue in London, and has been a member of the Board of Trustees and Vice Chairman of the Aspen Musical Festival and School. Cita is also a Churchill Fellow of the National Churchill Museum in Fulton, Missouri. Cita is also a Board Member of the Sandra Day O'Connor Institute for American Democracy.

Her first book, *Dinner with Churchill: Policy-Making at the Dinner Table*, was published in 2013. Her second book, *Working with Winston: The Unsung Women Behind Britain's Greatest Statesman*, was published in 2019. She is working on a third book about Winston Churchill.
