

Who is organizing and managing Franklin 162?

- Atlanta Campaign, Inc. is a 501(c3) non-profit that produces and manages Civil War Reenactments to support Historic Battlefield Preservation. Past events include Chickamauga 2023, Stones River 2021, Mill Springs 2019, Shiloh 2017 and Atlanta (2001 – 2014.)

When and where will the Battle of Franklin be held?

- The Battle of Franklin will be located at Walker County Industrial Drive, LaFayette, GA 30728 on October 2 through 4, 2026.

How much will it cost Visitors and when can they attend Franklin?

- Adults will pay \$15 each; Children 6 to 17 pay \$5 each; Children 5 and under are free.
- There is a parking fee of \$5 for each vehicle.
- Visitors are welcome to tour the camps and visit Sutlers between 9am and 5pm on Saturday and Sunday, (October 2nd & 3rd.)
- Admission is a daily rate and does not cover the entire weekend.

What time are the battles on Saturday and Sunday for Spectators?

- A battle for Spectators will occur at 2pm on Saturday and Sunday at the designated battlefield.

Where can I get updated information on a regular basis or ask a question about Franklin?

Are there any hotels or motels nearby?

- There are places to stay in LaFayette and in neighboring towns. We would recommend that you do a Google search to locate something that works for you.

How much is the Reenactor fee for Franklin?

- The Reenactor Fee has been set at \$30 until **September 1, 2026**; after this date the Fee will be \$40. Walk-ons will pay \$40 on-site in cash. There are no other fees. Hay and Ice will be offered for sale to re-enactors below cost.

When is the cut-off date for registration substitutions and refunds?

- The cut-off date for registration substitutions and refunds is **September 1, 2026**.

What is the best way of registering me and/or my unit for Franklin?

- On-Line and Mail-In Registration is available on the website at <https://atlantacampaign.com/reenactor-registration>
- Please register as a group with payment together if at all possible.
- A single artillery unit must register at least six paid registrations in order to receive a bounty.
- To register multiple artillery units at one time, it is recommended to use the mail-in registration form and write in the artillery piece for each unit.
- When registering multiple artillery units, each unit must register at least six paid registrations per artillery piece in order to receive a bounty. For example, if registering two artillery pieces, you must submit 12 paid registrations in order to receive two bounties.

Will Artillery bounties be available?

- All Artillery units must have a full 6 man crew in order to collect a bounty. No exceptions.
- The Artillery bounty will be \$150 per gun and available to the first 20 guns registered for each side only.
- The Artillery Commander will determine if a unit can take the field with less than a 6 man crew.
- Artillery will be limited to a maximum of 60 guns (30 Federal & 30 CSA); this excludes horse drawn artillery. Please bring a full, trained 6 man crew with you and avoid recruiting infantry to get your numbers up.

Will I be able to access my tent by car or pick-up after I have set-up camp?

- No car traffic will be allowed in or out of the camps; once you have set-up camp, you cannot move your vehicle in-or-out of the property to reach your campsite.
- You cannot keep your vehicle in the park all day; you will need to get in, unload and move out.
- There is a plan to have some type of shuttle service between Reenactor parking and the camps where needed.

How early will I be able to set-up camp before the weekend of the event?

- Staff will be on-site on Monday, September 28, 2026.
- Please come early and set-up to beat the rush; Commanders have been asked to be on-site no later than Wednesday, September 30, 2026.

How soon can I leave the site after the last battle on Sunday?

- Vehicles must stay out of camp until 5pm on Sunday.
- Consider camping Sunday night and leaving Monday if that is possible to avoid the rush.

Can I or a friend use a drone at the event?

- **No drones** can be flown over the site without prior permission .

Can I take pictures or video of the event?

- **No Commercial Photography is allowed** without prior permission from the event organizers. Photography and video to be used for non-commercial purposes will be allowed for spectators and reenactors.
