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
Message from Technical Advisor

Who we are?

A dedicated organisation which shares hope and empowering underprivileged communities through compassionate services, educational initiatives and sustainable development programs.



Scholarship program

The scholarship program aims to uplift vulnerable and marginalized children by providing them with educational opportunities based on both merit and vulnerability. This initiative is driven by the collaboration of the community and social welfare organizations. The program recognizes that these children face significant challenges and seeks to break down barriers by offering scholarships that empower them to pursue their dreams and overcome societal obstacles. In the year 2024 we managed to pay for 16 beneficiaries for their school fees that is first and second term. In the year 2023 we had 16 O-Level ZIMSEC examination and 7 of them had 5 subjects and above. By investing in their education, the program strives to create a brighter future for these children and their community, fostering equality and nurturing their talents. Through community support and social welfare efforts, this program aims to transform lives and provide a pathway to success for those who need it most.



Climate Change

Our thematic program focuses on addressing climate change through education for children. We aim to raise awareness, foster responsibility and empower young learners to become environmental stewards. Collaboration with relevant stakeholders, including government agencies, NGOs and scientific institutions, is a key component of our approach. We were involved in clean-up campaign in collaboration with other stakeholders that we work with in Kadoma and Chinhoyi. Together we develop curriculum materials, organize workshops, and implement practical projects to create a sustainable future. By equipping children with knowledge, skills, and values, we strive to inspire meaningful action against climate change and protect our planet.



Drug and substance abuse

Our program focuses on combating drug and substance abuse through raising awareness and collaboration with other organizations. We strive to educate young people, about the dangers of substance abuse and equip them with the knowledge and skills to make informed decisions. Through partnerships with government agencies, non-profit organizations and healthcare providers, we develop comprehensive strategies and implement prevention programs. Drug sessions were done in schools By advocating for evidence-based approaches and creating a supportive environment, we aim to make a lasting impact in preventing addiction and promoting healthier communities. A total number reached 300 in schools. Together, we can bring about positive change and support individuals and families affected by drug and substance abuse.



Anti- Child Marriage

Our thematic area focuses on ending child marriage through collaboration with stakeholders and raising awareness. We work with governments, community leaders and organizations to advocate for change and protect the rights of children. By raising awareness about the harmful effects of child marriage and promoting education, we aim to challenge societal norms and prevent early marriages. We also address the underlying causes of child marriage, such as poverty and gender inequality. Through our collective efforts, we strive to create a future where every child can grow and thrive without being subjected to the detrimental impacts of child marriage.



Aflateen and Aflayouth

Aflayouth is a new program that builds upon the success of Aflateen, focusing on social and financial education for young people from the age of 16-24. Aflateen from the year 2021-2023 young people reached 1200. It aims to equip young people with a broader range of skills, including social and financial skills, employability skills and entrepreneurship skills. By providing comprehensive education in these areas, Aflayouth empowers youth to navigate the complexities of adulthood, make informed decisions, and create opportunities for themselves.

2024 Young Researcher's Initiative



EQUINET Regional Meeting




