THE INTERN

To be eligible, you must be:

- Under age 25 on June 1, 2023
- A member or child of a member in good standing at a LIAC UU congregation

AND one of the following:

- A high school senior in fall 2023
- An undergraduate college or continuing-education student
- A gap-year student
- A spring 2023 college graduate

Is the internship only for summer?

SAF interns may participate in the program during the summer and during the 2023–2024 school year.

Must the interns work in person and on Long Island?

The interns may work in person or online, anywhere in the world.

What is the SAF grant stipend?

The amount is **\$13/hour** for high school seniors; **\$15/hour** for college or continuing-education students. The awards are tax-free and not subject to Social Security withholding. Student Activity Fund (SAF) is a grant program funded by the Unitarian Universalist Veatch Program at Shelter Mock that enables high school seniors and college students to perform significant service to the community while earning money to help finance their education. The program is sponsored by the Long Island Area Sponsored by the Long Island Area

Our Mission

The purpose of SAF is to encourage young Unitarian Universalists to live their religious values and gain awareness of society's social and economic problems through internships at nonprofit agencies that focus on social action, advocacy, or social services.

How It Works

The SAF intern finds an eligible nonprofit to work for, then receives an hourly stipend via an SAF grant. In summer, the intern may work up to 35 hours per week. There is no cost to the nonprofits that accept SAF interns.

THE NONPROFIT

To receive funding for work done through the SAF student internship program, the intern must choose a nonprofit organization whose goals are **one or more of the following**:

- Directly aimed at alleviating inequity, injustice, and discrimination
- Encouraging the formulation and implementation of public policies that promote world peace or ecological responsibility
- Designed to preserve and protect
- Related to the direct provision of needed services to disadvantaged sectors of society

Students cannot receive an SAF grant as a volunteer for a particular political to SAF's guidelines as a religious andidate or party campaign, according to SAF's guidelines as a religious
