

Those wanting to take the General or Extra Class exams will be able to do so.

Q: Why are you holding this class?

A: Members of CERT Teams from all of our mountain communities, COAD organizations, members of faith based groups, and members of the mountain communities have asked about getting their "ham" license with a class that is up on the hill. We now offer such classes with convenient times for mountain residents.

Q: Do I need to know about electronics and other stuff to take this class?

A: No you do not. The Technician License is the entry level FCC license and is meant for anyone. People from 9 years old to 90 have taken and passed the 35 question multiple choice exam. There is no requirement to learn Morse Code any longer

Q: Do I have to attend this class to get my license?

A: No. All that is technically required is to take and pass the FCC exam at any location where it is offered. We are offering this review class and exam at a convenient location. In our class you will get a better understanding of amateur radio and the important principals you need to know to be a good radio operator. You will also have an opportunity to see and use a wide variety of equipment.

Q: Can I study before I get to class.

A: Our class is a <u>review</u> of all questions. You MUST study first. We have found that to pass the exam you must read the book and also log into <u>www.qrz.com</u> and take some practice tests before our review session. We have a 98% passing rate for those who follow these simple steps.
