### Membership Info

embership in the Mountain Top Amateur Radio Association (c) is open to any person interested in learning more about Amateur Radio.

Members do not have to be a licensed Amateur Radio Operator to be a member but licensure is recommended. Members must be active in club activities which includes trainings, events, club meetings and Field Day. Membership is on an annual basis and is from January 1 to December 31 of each year. ### Echolink Update

or those who are away from their radios during our MTARA nets you can always check in using Echolink from your computer, smart phone or tablet. Setup is easy and fast but you must wait for confirmation of your call sign before you are enabled. This verification makes sure only license amateur radio operators are using the system.

Echolink is always up on MTARA2 except for maintenance once a week for about 10 minutes. We can switch the MTARA Echolink to any 2-meter frequency if necessary in an emergency. The node is WM6T-L.

#### A "Bust" Activation! - K6WDE

neaking away from my new granddaughter on Thursday, August 27th, I went to <u>Sugarloaf Ridge State Park</u> in the northern Sonoma county foothills for an impromptu activation of WWFF KFF-1200 and POTA K-1200. Bringing my portable, 10 watt QRP radio setup, I was operational by 10:30 a.m. and was calling CQ on both SSB and CW on 40 and 20 meters. By 2:00 p.m., I had scored a total of 2 contacts, one in Denver, CO and one in Carlsbad, CA!

Somewhat dejected, while packing up, I talked to a friendly park ranger who knew about ham radio. I mentioned my dismal effort and he proceeded to describe the 'bowl' that I was in surrounded by the mountains around me. He stated that the **Robert Ferguson Observatory** 1/4 mile away from me was chosen for that EXACT location, because the peaks surrounding the telescope cut down on the local light pollution!


Duh, lesson learned, check out your proposed activation surroundings before heading out!

#### I am LOST! - KG6RFY

ednesday, August 12th, several of us met at Tracy & Jodi's home, 8:00 a.m.., to venture off on our "I Am Lost" event. Approximately 14 individuals (all members), participated in this coordinated exercise. On arrival, our first stop was a Tailgate Session for a quick overall briefing.



We discussed the importance of always "pressurizing" our vehicles – in other words, keep your windows rolled up and turn up the air conditioner. It was particularly hot & dry that day.

Paul was our fearless leader: Navigator Al6AP – he gave us constant reminders &

tips on how to safely caravan together. Keep the person behind you in sight. We were told to always follow the car in front of you – always see the car behind you. It sounds easy, but at times was a challenge. The terrain was tough, with lots of turns and rough dirt roads, in the middle of nowhere. Paul asked if we were ALL together, and then we waited for the affirmation to proceed – and we were told to go SLOW. He watched out for traffic.



Basic house rules: bathroom procedure was boys to the left, girls to the right – use bushes.

We chose teams & divided ourselves into Team 1 (on foot), and Team 2 (in cars). It

was important to have a compass, and set the compass readings to an accurate, prescribed setting. Along the way we often stopped to reset GPS

coordinates – and, we of course, used our ham radios to check in with the group. We took turns being the "trail leader".



It was a good exercise in following directions, working together as a new group, utilizing our compass / GPS, and having extra GPS software on a smart phone,

rather than the regular GPS.

It was a hot, dusty trail – we quickly learned our weaknesses and were reminded of what we lacked in personal expertise. We learned that it was easier to prepare ahead of time – preset radios to the recommended, agreed upon frequency – and preset the compass before venturing off, confirming coordinates as we drove toward our end destination.

This was a fabulous exercise in COMMUNICATION – helping each other to find our way !!

### WWFF-KFF and POTA MTARA "WA6MTN" Spotting Information

hen MTARA operators are activating on World Wide Flora and Fauna (WWFF-KFF) or Parks-on-the-Air (POTA), spotting is strongly encouraged. Activator self-spotting IS ALLOWED because you gotta' make those contacts!

Remember, for a successful activation of WWFF, 44 contacts are required and for POTA, 10 contacts are required to be logged.

You can make a FREE account on both programs:

- WWFF-KFF, http://wwff.co/ and under LOGIN on the left margin, click <u>Register</u>.
- POTA, https://parksontheair.com/, click the <u>Dashboard/Login</u> tab.

#### For WWFF specific

- Facebook posting is very popular. If you have an account, join the FB group https:// www.facebook.com/groups/wwff.co/. Activators and chasers update their posts in real time, when cell or internet service are available.
- WWFF has an agenda page where you can schedule in advance, your upcoming activation, http:// wwff.co/agenda/. This notifies chasers of upcoming opportunities.
- WWFF has its own DX Cluster tool at http://wwff.co/ dx-cluster/. Here, you can POST (self post too) a spot or SEARCH for a spot.
- WWFF has a quick, simple mobile website, smartWWFF at https://www.cqgma.org/wwff/ smartwwff/wwffspots.php?i=0 suited ideally for mobile devices. It lets you POST and SEARCH as well.

Finally, the standard spotting networks are also alive with WWFF and POTA spots. When spotting (self or chaser), make sure that the location designator is included in your spot, KFF-1200 (WWFF) or K-4463 (POTA), for example. You can use:
