What to Discuss:

- What are your career and personal aspirations?
- Do you both want to travel, start a business, or live in a particular place?
- How do your goals support each other?

3. Communication Styles and Conflict Resolution

Why It Matters: Every marriage faces conflict; how you handle it determines its success.

What to Discuss:

- How do you express your emotions during disagreements?
- Do you listen actively and seek to understand?

 How will you resolve conflicts—counseling, prayer, or compromise? James 1:19 – "Be quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to become angry."

4. Financial Expectations and Money Management

Why It Matters: Financial stress is one of the leading causes of divorce.

What to Discuss:

What to Discuss:

 What are your expectations for physical affection and intimacy?

- How do you view sex within marriage, and what boundaries are important?
- How will you keep intimacy strong during stressful seasons? 1 Corinthians 7:3-5 – "The husband should fulfill his marital duty to his wife, and likewise the wife to her husband."

9. Lifestyle and Daily **Habits**

Why It Matters: Small daily habits can either strengthen or weaken your relationship.

What to Discuss:

- Do you have similar routines (early riser vs. night owl, cleanliness, hobbies)?
- How will you divide household chores?
- How much alone time or personal space do you need?

10. Handling Stress and Crisis

Why It Matters: Tough times will come, and your response can make or break your marriage.

What to Discuss:

- How do you handle stress and major life challenges?
- What is your coping mechanism—prayer, silence, or external support?
- How will you support each other during health issues, job loss, or family crises? Ecclesiastes 4:9-10 – "Two are better than one... if either of them falls, one can help the other up."

11. Boundaries with Friends and the Opposite Sex
