Kerry Bowden is a West Australian award- winning playwright who has had her plays produced in state, national and international artistic contexts. She won the People's Choice award for the Maj Monologue statewide competition at His Majesty's Theatre for the play *Handy Man* and was a finalist in the National Short and Sweet Competition at Sydney's Seymour Theatre. Her play Birth, Death and Somewhere in Between was selected to be included in the Edmonton International Fringe Festival in Canada. At a more local level, Kerry's work has been performed at various venues and festivals in Perth including The Blue Room Theatre, PS Arts Space, Spare Parts Puppet Theatre, Fringe World, Fremantle Festivals and Subiaco Arts Centre Festival. She also enjoys creating plays for site-specific theatre, including the up-close and personal production of The Car Project. After her play Veneer was performed at the Blue Room Theatre, it was also performed at Fremantle Men's Shed. Kerry was delighted when Heart Lines was published by Australian Plays Transform enabling the script to be distributed as a production-ready play for both professional and community theatre contexts.

As a playwright, Kerry likes to shed light on the connectivity that exists between one person and another. Whether it be familial, friendship-based or sheer randomness, the emotional ruptures that can occur in relationships inform her writing and practice. In its rawest form, *Heart Lines* portrays the unique and almost spiritual bond between two youths; one the heart donor, the other the heart recipient. She wrote the play to be tender-tough, where hope and elation sit beside grief and despair. Kerry enjoys embedding monologues in her script writing as it allows the character to speak from the heart with the opportunity for greater emotionality and interiority. Kerry is thrilled to have the opportunity to have *Heart Lines* performed in a community theatre context at Melville Theatre Company.

Kerry is also an artistic director who has directed many of her own plays and those of other playwrights. She has recently become involved in directing Shakespearean play readings including *Much Ado About Nothing* and *Measure for Measure* at the New Fortune Theatre at the University of Western Australia. Directorially, she immensely enjoys, the transformative journey of moving written words into a dynamic theatrical performance. As the director of *Heart Lines*, Kerry enjoys the opportunity to direct such a talented and collaborative cast who have all worked creatively and rigorously to attain authenticity and emotional truth in the characters they play.

Brandon has particularly enjoyed unearthing the complexities of Pete's duality, striving to authentically balance his comedic larrikin nature with his genuine care for his struggling friend. Travis studied Theatre Arts at Curtin University, where he also completed his Honours as an actor with distinction. During this time, he accumulated a number of stage credits at Curtin's Hayman Theatre, headlined by productions such as A Single Act, The Laramie Project and The Importance of Being Earnest.

Since graduating, Travis has mainly focused on screen acting, training under a number of esteemed coaches through 2024 at the PAC Advanced Studio, and earlier this year continuing his practice in LA via The Hollywood Initiative. 


