Craig Griffen

Craig Griffen began working in the Perth theatre community on stage in shows such as *Hairspray* (2012 SCTC) and *Wizard of Oz* (2013 KAC). Craig is now best known for his behind-the-scenes work directing and designing *Spring Awakening* (2016 FBP), *Urinetown* (2018 MTC), *The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe* 2019 KAC) and *Next to Normal* (2020 MTC). Craig has been awarded several ITA Finley Awards including Best Director and Best Musical for *Urinetown* in 2018 at Melville Theatre Company.

Musical Director

Taui Pinker

A self-taught pianist, Taui started as a church and choir accompanist at age 14. At 18 he upskilled as a choir conductor and began working more intensely with vocalists. This passion to diversify his musical portfolio continued following a move to Melbourne, where at age 23 he became fellow founder and Principal Conductor of the Melbourne Regional Orchestra, whilst holding various positions as a musical director and accompanist for numerous choral engagements and projects.

In 2012 he returned to Perth and undertook an invitation to play Keys for a production of Sunset Boulevard where his love of Musical Theatre began. On keys, Taui's credits include Little Shop of Horrors, The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee and Annie. As Musical Director; Beauty and the Beast, Altar Boyz, Young Frankenstein, Spamalot, Ruthless!, Urinetown, The Boy From Oz, Tick Tick BOOM, Kinky Boots, Heathers, Seussical the Musical, My Fair Lady, Curtains and Xanadu. Taui has won the Robert Finley Award for Best Musical Director three times, for Urinetown (2018), The Boy From Oz (2019) and Curtains (2022, shared with Tara Oorjitham), and has been nominated eight times.

Musical Director

Tara Oorjitham

Having played the clarinet since primary school, Tara pursued her love of music through high school and into university, studying to become a music teacher at WAAPA/ECU. Tara has been teaching now for 8 years, has played in community orchestras and in pit bands with several different theatres. In recent years she has done a little less playing and a lot more conducting - taking on the role of musical director for shows such as *Les Miserables* (Marloo), *Next to Normal* (Melville), *Footloose* (Art in Motion) and most recently, *Once Upon a Mattress* (Art in Motion). In 2018 she won the Break- Through Finley award for her musical direction of *Little Miss Sunshine* and at the most recent ceremony she and Taui Pinker were awarded Best Musical Director for their work on *Curtains* (Koorliny).




Lochlan Curtis (He/Him) as Seymour


Grace Johnson as Audrey


Daniel Burton as Audrey II
