From the Director

As a director I try to vary the kinds of plays I choose. Genre, cast size, style, nationality of playwright and setting of the play. Keeping it interesting for myself, and the audience by not always producing the same kind of thing. After the frantic chaos of *William Shakespeare's Long Lost First Play (abridged)* in 2021, where three actors played most of Shakespeare's famous characters in one fictional first play, a hoot of a show, I directed the beautiful and moving Australian play, *Things I Know To be True* last year. An incredible show that won the Robert Finley Award for Best Play in 2022.

2021 - small cast, madcap American comedy.

2022 - mid sized cast, unforgettable Australian family drama.

2023 - where does Quiz fit into this categorising?

It is not a traditional comedy, but it is funny. It has audience participation, but it is not a pantomime. It has some moving scenes, but it is not a drama. Based on a true story but a work of fiction. A big cast, 16, and even more characters.

I am unsure how I stumbled upon the script; my search parameters usually involve something like; Drama, contemporary, Australian, small cast, or award winning, American, classic. I don't recall typing in; British, based on true story, large cast, 40+ characters. But stumble upon I did, and I was engrossed from beginning to end of that first reading. After which, despite the clock ticking past midnight on a school night, I lost myself down the rabbit hole of online research. I was unsure if it was real, had someone really tried to cheat on *Who Wants to Be A Millionaire* by having people cough on the right answers? I had never heard about the scandal, nor about the 2020 TV miniseries of the same name.

The more I investigated and reread the script, the more fascinated I became. I was taken by questions it raised. Were they guilty? Did they get a fair trial? Was it trial by media? How real is reality TV? And some even deeper; what kind of responsibility should the media have for their manipulation of the public? Likewise, television producers. A study in how quickly a mob mentality can grow when provoked. And interestingly, how James Graham in his take on the story, does a similar thing. Is he not also manipulating the audience?

I loved the style of the play, and the clever comparison of the quiz show and the dramatics of a courtroom. The story and how it is presented is fascinating. How accurate the fictionalised retelling of that story is, in my opinion, not overly important. It is not the point of the piece. Ironic when my favourite line in the *Quiz* is; *"that they should be able to resist the temptation of a more entertaining lie, over a less extraordinary truth."*

I would like to extend my sincere thanks to my wonderful cast and crew for helping bring my vision to life. Their talent, dedication, humour and hard work have made the process all the more enjoyable.



Vanessa has been involved in Perth community theatre for over 20 years, at both Old Mill and Melville Theatres as stage manager, crew, lighting and sound operator, box office, bar or front of house, set dressing and set painting, on committee and directing. Directing is her main love. She has directed a wide variety of shows over the past 18 years. Three Jane Austen's (one she dramatised herself), classics like *Twelve Angry Men, Away* and *Amadeus* and more unknown pieces like *Love, Loss and What I Wore*. Ridiculous comedies like *One Man, Two Guvnors* and *William Shakespeare's Long Lost First Play (abridged)* and moving dramas like *Rabbit Hole, Mr Bailey's Minder*, and *Things I Know to be True*. These last three plays, as well as *Twelve Angry Men*, won the Robert Finley Award for Best Play for their year, and also saw Vanessa win Best

Director twice. She has worked with innumerable wonderful people along the way, who've won plenty of awards themselves, and many who've become dear friends. Vanessa loves the community of community theatre; the comradery, the quick and strong bonds formed with other liked minded individuals who you share time and space with intensely for a few months; and the common goal of creating something special together.

The audience is a part of that process, that community, in this show possibly more than in most. So have your phone ready when asked, so you can enter the code given and help to give the final answer!




Paul Hogan

Paul got the theatre bug in 1979 playing Harry Butler in a lunch time comedy skit at school. He was involved in St Vincent Hospital reviews in Sydney in 1980 and 1981. He then joined the Australian Theatre for Young People in Sydney, notably playing 15 year old Nicole Kidman's father in *Spring Awakening*. He studied theatre for a year in Melbourne in 1985 and then joined a Community Theatre in Goulburn performing health promotion shows in the community and in schools. In Goulburn he also performed as the titular character in Chekhov's *The Bear* in 1987. His last performance was in 1992 when he was sponsored by Perth's Artrage Festival to perform *Day Dream Yard*, a one hander, one act play that he had written whilst studying Art at East Sydney Tech.

It has been a long time between drinks and Paul is loving his first engagement with Vanessa Jensen and the other actors at Melville Theatre Company.


