

Maria The von Trapp Family story

"An only child, an orphan" - I had a most unhappy childhood" - Maria von Trapp.

Maria was born on a train and delivered by the conductor (father of nine) somewhere between Vienna and the Tirol. Her parents both died when she was very young and Maria spent her early years in a household of adults with little contact with other children her age.

This was an Austria emerging from the agonies of the Great War, the Vienna of 1918, where the so-called new regime was discouraging religion and, if anything, actually injecting anti-religious feeling into the school system.

Maria left school with a non-sympathetic attitude to her religion and in fact became a leader of a group dedicated to promoting anti-Catholic feeling.

One Palm Sunday a chance meeting with a Jesuit priest changed

Maria's life forever and gave her back her religion and faith. Soon, Maria decided she had to give something back and so joined the strictest convent in Salzburg, the Benedictine Abbey of Nonberg - this is where the joyous story of The Sound of Music starts - Maria who admits she was something of a tomboy, but in her own words: -"I was

constantly in trouble. First of all, one wasn't supposed to whistle

wordly tunes, but what was wrong in whistling a hymn or Gregorian chant? Then one was supposed to take only one step at a time upstairs and downstairs, whereas it was much easier to come down the bannister, or two at a time. I had been used to being outdoors as much as possible. Vienna has wonderful surroundings such as the famous Vienna Woods. Suddenly, I found myself in a cloistered community, surrounded by walls, a rather small garden sloping up a hill to the very foundations and buttresses of the famous Fortress of Salzburg".

From this cloistered community Maria was sent as tutor to the von Trapp family and - well, the world knows the rest of this remarkable story.

Where is the von Trapp family now? After the family fled their home country they settled in America, where the Trapp Family Singers became internationally famous, touring extensively throughout the world for concert performances and lectures. Today, Maria von Trapp is living in retirement in Stowe, Vermont, U.S.A., her own son Johannes manages the estate. The captain died in 1947 and the von Trapp children are living in many parts of the world— one daughter is a missionary in Port Moresby.


She would like to thank her amazing cast and crew who are bringing this beautiful musical back to life and wishes to dedicate the season to the memory of "David". It has completed the circle.


Melissa Kelly (Sister Sophia understudy)
