### Birth, Death and Somewhere in Between

The storyline of *Birth, Death and Somewhere in Between* is progressed by using the dramatic form of monologue writing. It is a form I deliberately chose as I believe monologues provide characters with a deeper opportunity to articulate their emotions, inner thoughts and their humanity. I wanted the setting spare and pared back so that each character's voice was the main focus for the audience rather than a decorative setting. I also wanted the back-stage elements of the play to be deprivatised, with any costume or prop change to be performed in front of the audience.

Performing a series of monologues of numerous characters with different ages, gender and personalities is often a challenging task for any performer. For sole actor, Nick Stevenson, inhabiting each character uniquely and authentically, before nimbly taking on the life of another character, has ensured seamless transitions between storylines.

We hope audiences enjoy both the levity and sometimes sadder moments of the human condition portrayed in the play.

I wrote *Choking* with the Co-Director of Stella Theatre Company and longtime writing partner Lynda Butler. She was playing around with one of her roleplay characters and we started riffing about his story and *Choking* suddenly sprung into life. Our first great surprise was Melville Theatre Company giving us the green light on a synopsis. I reckon that takes guts. Thank you Melville Theatre Company and Kayti Murphy for your support.

We wrote the first draft, I cast it and then had the incredible luxury of workshopping it with the actors. I also wrote another character in after the auditions to include an actor who had impressed me. Their generous input was an incredible help. Every director raves about their actors but the team on this project was just so creative and flexible.

Choking is set in a hotel 'Retreat on The Esplanade' where Tim and Paul work on the front desk. We set out to tell one man's story but other characters presented themselves to us along the way and we eventually created a bigger world.

The second great surprise was the response to my advertisement for volunteers to take part in a Parade as part of the play. I held an acting workshop for them and they excelled themselves. Each one has made their own very personal contribution to the story.
