Executive Summary

The Chinese American Legal Defense Alliance (CALDA) combats systematic discrimination through civil rights litigation and education, aiming to stop Asian hate and protect the rights of Chinese Americans in the United States. CALDA positions itself as the ACLU for Chinese Americans.

CALDA is firmly committed to eradicating all forms of prejudice, discrimination, and hostility directed towards individuals of Chinese descent living in the United States. We call for a unified effort to create an inclusive and respectful society where Chinese Americans can live free from fear and injustice.

Between February 2023 and January 2024, CALDA generated a total income of \$256,828.16, with total expenses amounting to \$102,600. Throughout the year, CALDA engaged in two major litigations: the ongoing "Fight Against China Initiative" and the "End Florida SB 264," launched in February 2023.

Besides the ongoing litigations against the "China Initiative" since 2021, in 2023, Texas, Florida, and Georgia introduced bills aimed at prohibiting Chinese individuals from purchasing or owning real estate. These discriminatory laws, driven by the perception of China as a strategic enemy, equate Chinese Americans with the Chinese government, fostering a climate of prejudice and hostility. CALDA underscores the importance of combating these measures to prevent a repeat of past injustices and protect the rights and safety of Chinese Americans.

Despite limited resources, CALDA allocated significant efforts to challenge Florida's SB 264, achieving temporary success by the end of the year. Moving forward, CALDA will continue to build its legal strategy, prepare court documents, and strengthen collaborations with partner organizations to ensure the constitutional rights of Chinese Americans are upheld.

Key Accomplishments in 2023

1. Status of Ongoing Litigations Since 2021 - Fighting Against the "China Initiative"

CALDA has taken the federal government to court for its infamous "China Initiative," which has unfairly targeted Chinese American professors and scientists. We have two pending cases on the China Initiative against different government agencies, and we are determined to stop this type of racial profiling by the federal government.

The "China Initiative" represents a pernicious form of government-sanctioned racism, where discrimination is legitimized under the guise of national security or public interest. This initiative has disproportionately targeted Chinese American academics, raising significant concerns about racial bias and systemic injustice.

Since November 2021, CALDA has combated this injustice through several Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) filings against five government agencies.

CALDA's FOIA requests to the DOJ, NSF, NIH, FBI, DHS, and other agencies seek answers to three critical questions:

- 1. Did federal agencies investigate and prosecute academics for technical violations before the "China Initiative"? If so, how many involved Chinese Americans?
- 2. After the "China Initiative," how many investigations and formal charges were there, and how many involved Chinese American academics?
- 3. Of all investigations and charges under the "China Initiative," how many involved economic espionage or theft of technology for China, and how many of these cases involved Chinese American academics?

These actions align with President Biden's Executive Order to advance equity and racial justice and eliminate systemic racism in federal policies.

In May 2022, CALDA filed a FOIA lawsuit against the Department of Energy (DOE) to compel the release of data on its investigations and prosecutions of Chinese American professors under the "China Initiative." This lawsuit aims to expose government practices and reduce racial bias in future law enforcement actions. CALDA filed similar FOIA lawsuits against the Department of Justice on July 11, 2022, and the National Institutes of Health on July 17, 2023, to further uncover and challenge systemic racial bias. CALDA plans to file additional FOIA lawsuits against more federal agencies to continue this important work.

2. Legal Advocacy and Litigation of 2023

In response to the discriminatory bill passed in Florida, CALDA proactively launched legal challenges. In May 2023, CALDA organized and initiated a lawsuit against the Florida state government for its newly adopted alien land law, SB 264, which prohibits Chinese Americans from buying real properties. CALDA brought in ACLU and major law firms such as Quinn Emanuel as co-counsel, with the U.S. DOJ filing an amicus brief supporting our position. We achieved a significant win in early February 2024 when the 11th Circuit issued a partial injunction in favor of the plaintiffs.

	Timeline of "End Florida SB 264"
Date	Event
January 15, 2023	Texas Governor Greg Abbott's tweet about signing a bill prohibiting citizens and entities from China, Iran, North Korea, and Russia from purchasing property in Texas sparks widespread concern among Chinese Americans.
March 1, 2023	Similar discriminatory bills are proposed in Texas, Florida, and Georgia, aiming to ban Chinese nationals from buying real estate, based on national security concerns.
March 22, 2023	Public hearing on Texas HB2206, which seeks to ban the use of Chinese social media apps. CALDA prepares testimony for Chinese American representatives to oppose the bill.
May 8, 2023	Florida Governor Ron DeSantis signed SB264 into law, targeting Chinese nationals. It takes effect on July 1, 2023. CALDA immediately announced legal action to overturn the law. We are forming a legal team, contacting potential plaintiffs, and collaborating with groups like FAAJA and UCA to oppose this anti-Chinese measure.
May 15, 2023	Nearly 15 states propose similar bills. CALDA monitors these developments closely and plans legal action if necessary.
May 22, 2023	CALDA, with ACLU and AALDEF, files a lawsuit against Florida's SB264 in the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Florida.
June 7, 2023	CALDA's legal team files a preliminary injunction to prevent SB264 from taking effect. Quinn Emanuel Urquhart & Sullivan, LLP joins the lawsuit pro bono.
June 15, 2023	Hearing for the preliminary injunction scheduled for July 18, 2023, in Tallahassee. 19 civil rights organizations submitted an amicus brief supporting the injunction.
June 28, 2023	The U.S. Department of Justice files an amicus brief supporting CALDA's injunction request, indicating federal support for Chinese American rights.
July 18, 2023	Hearing for the preliminary injunction takes place in Tallahassee, with support rallies organized by APA Justice, FAAJA, and YWI.
August 17, 2023	The district court denies the preliminary injunction, allowing SB264 to remain in effect. CALDA announces plans to appeal the decision.

August 21, 2023	CALDA files an appeal with the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit and requests a stay of the law's enforcement during the appeal.
January 17, 2024	The appeals court grants CALDA's request for an expedited hearing.
February 1, 2024	The Eleventh Circuit grants a temporary injunction, allowing two
	Chinese American plaintiffs to purchase property without SB264
	restrictions, pending the final appeal decision. This suggests other
	Chinese buyers may also be exempt from the law's restrictions for
	now.


• WeChat Engagement

Website Traffic and Engagement


From February 2023 to January 2024, CALDA's official website (www.caldausa.org) achieved significant traffic, with 8.1K total visits. Of these, 5.8K came from organic searches, and around 7.1K visitors were from the U.S. Additionally, CALDA published 99 blog posts, with certain blogs receiving the highest number of clicks. Donation Support from Various Channels

From February 2023 to January 2024, CALDA received substantial donation support through multiple channels:

1. Benevity: 143 donation transactions from 26 companies. The transaction amounts and companies are detailed in the attached chart.



- 2. GoFundMe: 1,791 donation transactions.
- 3. Zelle Transfers: 1,974 donation transactions.
- 4. Checks: 54 check deposit transactions from various national civil society organizations.

Media Coverage

From February 2023 to January 2024, CALDA's efforts against the property ban targeting Chinese Americans were reported by 124 national and local media outlets. Notably, 29 of these reports directly mentioned CALDA. Prominent media coverage included Associated Press, CNN, NBC News, and The Washington Post, reflecting significant public interest and support for CALDA's mission.

Through these efforts, CALDA reaffirms its commitment to defending the civil rights of Chinese Americans and combating systemic racism and discrimination. The organization's work in 2023 has laid a strong foundation for continued advocacy and legal action in the face of growing challenges.


1. Sources of Funding and Income

Between February 2023 and January 2024, CALDA generated a total income of \$256,828.16 from direct public support. This includes contributions through platforms and methods such as GoFundMe, Benevity, Zelle, checks (from both individuals and businesses), the PayPal Giving Fund, the UKOGF Foundation, WePay, and Amazon Smile. 




The net income from February 2023 to January 2024 totaled \$154,228.16. (Refer to the graph below: All amounts are in USD).
