Don Moen's praise song "God Will Make a Way" affirms God's sovereign involvement in our lives. Here's how that song was written: Several years ago, Moen was awakened in the middle of the night. His mother-in-law called to tell him of a car accident involving his wife's sister, Susan. Susan and her husband, Craig, and their four little boys were on a trip when the accident happened. Jeremy, age eight and the oldest of the four boys, was killed instantly. The others were seriously injured.

As Don and his wife grieved and poured out their hearts to the Lord, they felt helpless at communicating hope and grace to Susan and Craig. Don says God helped him through the tragedy by giving him these words:

God will make a way when there seems to be no way. He works in ways we cannot see. He will make a way for me. He will be my guide; hold me closely to his side. With love and strength for each new day, he will make a way.

PART II - BRIEF HISTORY OF THE FIRST METHODIST CHURCH OF SPOONER by Lon LaBumbard

Rev. Willsey served the Shell Lake church and at Spooner until Rev. F. H. Harvey was appointed on October 12, 1888, and Rev. H.P. Waldron on September 23, 1889 then followed as pastor. On October 22, 1890 Rev. Luther Speers was assigned to Spooner. In 1891, during the year that Rev. Luther Speers served here, the first Methodist Church was build and dedicated. At first it served for both the Methodists and Episcopalians, but later was used entirely by the Methodists. Some of the money for it was raised by selling blocks from a map on the blackboard for the prices marked on them.

Short and effective pastorates followed with Rev. W.J. Speers on Sept 20, 1891, Revs. E.A. McKinney in 1894, Rev. George Brown in 1896, Rev. A.N Sweet in 1899, and Rev. Paul Hull in 1901. In April 1897 Mrs. Sara Gibbs was received into membership of the Spooner Methodist Episcopal Church. Mrs. Gibbs membership is the earliest

on record in Spooner records. Records also show that Mrs. Josephine Beers was received into membership on June 18, 1899. In 1900 the bell which is still in use was given by the G.V. Seigner family as a memorial for their daughter Helen Seigner. It was transferred to the present church when it was built in 1912-1913. They also gave the pulpit as a memorial. By this time the population of Spooner was listed as 800.......to be continued

Typhoon Ulysses

In the last meeting of Mission Committee, we had decided to send some help to the victims of Typhoon Ulysses in the Baguio Episcopal Area-Philippines. In November 2020, this small country has been visited by three powerful typhoons in three consecutive weeks. Typhoon Ulysses was the latest one, which struck the northern part of Luzon. Many were displaced from their homes and lost their crops and animals due to floods. There's also been a loss in human lives. Since we partnered with the Baguio Episcopal Area missionally in 2020, I was asked what were the pressing needs of the people there. I mentioned this tragedy where we could channel some little help. We could not substantially help every victim of the typhoon, but if we

could help even just one household that means a lot for that family. I'm appealing to your radical generosity. I know that we are also in the middle of pandemic. Whatever you could contribute to this project, the committee and the recipient(s) will appreciate it very much. May the Lord bless you more in your loving and living. Greetings and Blessings from Washburn County Unit of the Salvation Army. As we all are very aware, this Christmas season is going to be very different from what some of us have know in the past. We will again be ringing those Salvation Army bells at Schmitz's Economart and the Dollar Tree. We will try our best to keep both the ringers

and the kettle donors safe from this Covid crisis that we are in. The <u>needs</u> of the people we are trying to serve do not recognize Covid, so we still need your help.

We have implemented some procedures to help keep ringers and donors as safe as we possibly can. We will be supplying zip lock bags with sanitizer, disposable masks and gloves for your use. We ask that you take a few moments to read the handout and to sanitize the kettle with wipes that will be provided and follow all CVD procedures. There are extra copies of the handout if you would like to take one with for reference or to give one to anyone that might have questions regarding safety. For "no contact" giving, there are directions for three different ways to give using your smart phones.
