"So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand." – Isaiah 41:10

We are entering another new year in our lives. Thus, we are welcoming the new year 2022, whether we are excited about it or treat it just like another ordinary day or year. But if we just ponder about it for a few minutes and ask this question - 'What is waiting for me in the year 2022?' What's the first thing that comes to your mind, especially when you're carrying lots of baggage from the past year? (Who isn't?) Mission News

Mission Minute: Focus on UMCOR

"Founded in 1940, the United Methodist Committee on Relief is the global humanitarian relief agency of The United Methodist Church. A part of Global Ministries, UMCOR works in more than 80 countries worldwide, including the United States and its territories. The agency's mission, grounded in the teachings of Jesus, is to alleviate human suffering with open hearts and minds to all people. Working in the areas of disaster response and recovery, sustainable development and migration, UMCOR responds to natural or civil disasters that are interruptions of such magnitude that they overwhelm a community's ability to recover on its own."

Summary of two of many projects:

"United States Disaster Response"

UMCOR responded to these disasters in 2021: Tornadoes in the Midwest and Southeast, Hurricane Ida, Flash flooding in Tennessee, Tropical storm/Hurricane Henri, Tropical storm Fred, Wildfires in the West, Surfside Condo collapse in Florida, Flood recovery in Oregon, Severe weather in the Southeast and Winter storms in Texas.

UMCOR responds to natural or civil disasters of such magnitude that they overwhelm a community's ability to recover on its own. Through UMCOR, United Methodists extend loving care to people within the United States. When disaster strikes, it is local churches that provide the first response to their communities. This basic understanding—that disaster response is local—forms the foundation for UMCOR's US disaster training and response. When responding to a disaster in the United States, UMCOR provides training, financial assistance, expertise, community collaboration to churches and partners making them more resilient to disasters. "Love Beyond Borders"

Global Ministries is launching a new initiative and joining interfaith partners in an effort to increase the equitable distribution of the COVID-19 vaccine around the world. Funds donated to a new Advance giving project will support "Love Beyond Borders: The Interfaith Movement to End the Pandemic" campaign supporting UNICEF's global vaccine distribution efforts.

Proposed to Global Ministries by First United Methodist Church of Boise, Idaho's, missions team, "Love Beyond Borders: The Interfaith Movement to End the Pandemic" seeks to engage The United Methodist Church in supporting UNICEF's global COVID-19 response, including distributing safe, effective COVID-19 vaccines through the COVAX facility, diagnostics and treatments. Global Ministries and UMCOR have supported partners in Africa, Asia, Latin America, the Middle East and North America as they work to respond to the pandemic and its impacts.

Through this initiative, members of The United Methodist Church will contribute to UNICEF's historic efforts in leading the procurement and supply of 1.4 billion COVID-19 vaccines to approximately 196 participating COVAX countries and economies by the end of 2021. For just \$37 dollars, members can help provide 10 people with two doses of the vaccine.

Global Ministries has created **Advance #3022671** for this effort to ensure that 100% of donations go directly to UNICEF USA for this project.
