Some people are not following the daily news nowadays. It's like a never-ending film series wherein the plot and the characters are

always the same to the dismay of the audiences. However, this time, what we have is a real-life story where people are really suffering and dying. Our plans and dreams in the future are shattered or are in limbo. News' headlines send mixed messages and we seldom get good news from them. They are screaming loud but not necessarily clear to us. Check these examples which are taken from the Homiletics Magazine (7/2020).

Although we're as likely to encounter news headlines today in the breaking-news crawl at the bottom of a TV screen as we are in largepoint Helvetica type on the newspaper page, some headlines have unintended meanings. For example:

- Something Went Wrong in Jet Crash, Expert Says
- Miners Refuse to Work after Death
- Juvenile Court to Try Shooting Defendant
- War Dims Hope for Peace
- Red Tape Holds Up New Bridges
- New Study of Obesity Looks for Larger Test Group
- Local High School Dropouts Cut in Half
- Typhoon Rips Through Cemetery; Hundreds Dead

How we wish that when we read or hear the headline, it will bring a smile on our faces or even to some extent make us open our eyes and mouth widely in total surprise or amazement. But the opposite happens. They make us frustrated and sad. The psalmist prayer in 13:1 – "How long, O Lord?" is still apt until today. Yet there is a time that we have just not found the right words about it. We just bow down, hold a deep breath and sigh, and then throw our arms in the air.

But hold a second, did you know that sighing is also a form of prayer? When David is looking for deliverance from his enemies, he says, "**Give ear to my words, O Lord; give heed to my sighing**." (Psalm 5:1). Mark Batterson, a pastor and author re "<u>Whisper: How to Hear the Voice of God"</u> (2017), explains:

A sigh is a long, deep breath. It's a physiological response to sadness. And it is very similar to the gentle whisper of the still small voice. Sighing is what we do when we don't

know what to say. But according to the psalmist, it's more than a low-frequency distress signal; it's a wordless prayer.

Therefore, every sigh is definitely a prayer; it's audible, loud, and clear to our Lord Almighty. Let us quit living as if our Lord Jesus is still nailed on the cross. The only thing nailed to the cross is our sin. (Colossians 2:14). Let's put our trust and hope in God. Remember this promise, this prayer (which is also my prayer for you). May you keep it as the daily headline in your heart and soul, that our God is more able and faithful than we could ask or imagine. Ephesians 3:20-21 proclaims,

Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine...to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen.
