O CANADA – CALIXA LAVALLÉE/ARR. VINCE GASSI

The national anthem of Canada, *O Canada* was composed by Calixa Lavallée in 1880 with lyrics by Sir Adolphe-Basile Routhier. Originally written in French, an English version was later adopted. It became Canada's official national anthem in 1980. This arrangement by Vince Gassi adds a contemporary and symphonic touch to this beloved anthem.

THE STAR-SPANGLED BANNER — WALTER DAMROSCH & J.P. SOUSA

The national anthem of the United States, *The Star-Spangled Banner* is based on a poem by Francis Scott Key, set to the melody of a British song. This particular arrangement, influenced by Walter Damrosch and John Philip Sousa, brings a rich orchestration and a stirring, patriotic feel to the anthem.

THE MUSIC MAN — SELECTIONS MEREDITH WILSON/ARR. JOHNNIE VINSON

Meredith Willson's *The Music Man* is a Broadway classic that tells the story of con man Harold Hill, who arrives in River City, lowa, with plans to deceive the townspeople but ultimately finds redemption through love and music. This selection features some of the show's most recognizable songs, including *76 Trombones* and *Till There Was You*.

MARY POPPINS — SELECTIONS RICHARD AND ROBERT SHERMAN/ARR. TED RICKETTS

Disney's Mary Poppins (1964) remains a timeless classic, featuring music by the Sherman Brothers. This arrangement showcases memorable songs such as A Spoonful of Sugar, Supercalifragilisticexpialidocious, and Chim Chim Cher-ee, capturing the whimsical and magical spirit of the beloved nanny.

MAN OF LA MANCHA JOE DARION & MITCH LEIGH/ARR. JUSTIN WILLIAMS

Inspired by Miguel de Cervantes' Don Quixote, Man of La Mancha debuted in 1965 and quickly became a Broadway sensation. This arrangement features the soaring anthem The Impossible Dream, among other powerful melodies from the musical.

A CHORUS LINE - MARVIN HAMLISCH/ARR. JOHN CACAVAS

One of Broadway's longest-running shows, *A Chorus Line* (1975) offers a behind-the-scenes look at the dreams and struggles of aspiring performers. Marvin Hamlisch's score, including songs like *One* and *What I Did for Love*, captures the excitement and emotion of the audition process.

FROZEN — HIGHLIGHTS ARR. STEPHEN BULLA

Disney's Frozen (2013) became a global phenomenon, and its soundtrack remains one of the most recognizable of the 21st century. This arrangement highlights hits like Let It Go and Do You Want to Build a Snowman?, bringing the magic of Arendelle to life.

MANNIN VEEN — HAYDN WOOD

Composed in 1933, *Mannin Veen* (*Dear Isle of Man*) is a tone poem based on traditional folk songs from the Isle of Man. Haydn Wood's lush orchestration and melodic writing capture the island's rich musical heritage and scenic beauty.

ZAMPA OVERTURE — L.J. HÉROLD

A lesser-known but thrilling overture, *Zampa* (1831) by Louis Joseph Ferdinand Hérold is a high-energy, dramatic work filled with brilliant orchestration and lively melodies.

FIDDLER ON THE ROOF — SYMPHONIC DANCES JERRY BOCK/ARR. IRA HEARSHEN

This arrangement captures the essence of *Fiddler on the Roof*, a 1964 musical that explores Jewish traditions and cultural changes. *The Symphonic Dances* incorporate lively folk dances, including the famous *Bottle Dance*, reflecting the spirit of the story.

THE KING AND I — RODGERS & HAMMERSTEIN/ARR. STEPHEN BULLA

A beloved Rodgers and Hammerstein classic, *The King and I* (1951) tells the story of Anna Leonowens and the King of Siam. This selection features unforgettable melodies such as *Getting to Know You* and *Shall We Dance*?

WEST SIDE STORY — SELECTIONS LEONARD BERNSTEIN/ARR. W.J. DUTHOIT

Leonard Bernstein's West Side Story (1957) is a landmark musical that reimagines Romeo and Juliet in 1950s New York. This arrangement highlights iconic songs such as Maria, Tonight, and America, showcasing Bernstein's masterful fusion of jazz, classical, and Latin influences.

PORGY AND BESS OVERTURE — GEORGE GERSHWIN/ARR. JAMES BARNES

George Gershwin's *Porgy and Bess* (1935) is a groundbreaking American opera featuring a mix of jazz, classical, and folk influences. This overture includes timeless songs like *Summertime* and *It Ain't Necessarily So.*

BROADWAY SPECTACULAR! — JOHN HIGGINS

A rousing medley, *Broadway Spectacular!* brings together some of the biggest hits from Broadway history. This thrilling arrangement is sure to delight musical theater fans.

SEMPER SUPRA — U.S. SPACE FORCE JAMES W. TEACHENOR/SEAN NELSON


Semper Supra (Always Above) is the official anthem of the U.S. Space Force, composed by James W. Teachenor with arrangement by Sean Nelson. Its bold and soaring melody reflects the mission and vision of this new military branch.

ARMED FORCES SALUTE — ARR. BOB LOWDEN

A tribute to the U.S. military, *Armed Forces Salute* features the official songs of the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, and Coast Guard, honoring those who have served.

GOD BLESS AMERICA — IRVING BERLIN/ARR. JOHN EDMONDSON

Originally written in 1918 and revised in 1938, Irving Berlin's God Bless America has become one of the nation's most cherished patriotic songs, often performed at significant national events.




DR. JOHN K. SOUTHALL, PHD

John K. Southall, PhD, is the Chair of the Performing & Visual Arts Department, Director of Bands, and Coordinator of Music Education at Indian River State College in Fort Pierce, Florida. Additionally, he serves as the Professional Development Conference Chairman of the Florida Music Education Association (FMEA), Music Director of the Port St. Lucie Community Band, and an advisory board member for the Midwest International Band and Orchestra Conference. Dr. Southall has been an active music education advocate, conductor, clinician, adjudicator, and presenter across the United States for over 36 years.

Previously, Dr. Southall has served as both past President and Chairman of the Finance committee for FMEA, editorial board member of the Research Perspectives in Music Education Journal, contributing author for the Florida Music Director magazine, and faculty member at Florida State University, the University of Missouri at St. Louis, Nova Southeastern University, and Broward Community College. He has also served as Florida's K-12 music curriculum specialist, President of the Broward County Music Educators Association, and the Director of Bands at Western, Piper, and Ely high schools in Broward County, Florida.

Dr. Southall was honored as the FMEA Florida College Music Educator of the Year, the Broward County Arts Teacher of the Year, the Western High School Teacher of the Year, and as a Music Education Legend by the Midwest International Band & Orchestra Conference. He is a recipient of the Midwest International Clinic Conference Medal of Honor, the Conference Service Award from the FMEA, and has recently been accepted into the American Bandmasters Association. Additionally, Dr. Southall is a two-time recipient of the Indian River State College Endowed Teaching Chair in Fine Arts.

Dr. Southall is a member of the Florida Music Education Association, the American Bandmasters Association, the Florida Bandmasters Association, the College Band Directors National Association, the National Association for Music Education, the Florida College Music Educators Association, Phi Beta Mu, Pi Kappa Lambda, Kappa Kappa Psi, and Tau Beta Sigma. He earned his PhD and MME from Florida State University and his BME from Florida A&M University.



MR. JAMES SAMMONS

James Sammons is a lifetime member of the Florida Bandmasters Association, having served the FBA for eighteen years in a variety of positions at the district and state level, including District Chairperson and President of the Florida Bandmasters Association from 1996 - 1998. He is a member of the American Bandmasters Association, the Florida Bandmasters Association Hall or Fame, the National Association for Music Education, and the National Band Association. He is a FBA-certified adjudicator in all areas. After 42 years of teaching, including 36 years at Vero Beach High School in Vero Beach, Florida, he retired as Director of Bands Emeritus in July 2016. He remains active as a conductor, clinician, and adjudicator.

He has been recognized as County Teacher of the Year and has received Official Proclamations and Citations from the City Council of Vero Beach, the Indian River County Board of Commissioners, the Veterans Council of Indian River County, the Legislature of the State of Florida, the Office of the Governor of the State of Florida, and former President of the United States, George W. Bush. He has been awarded the Citation of Excellence (4) from the National Band Association.

His bands at VBHS have appeared in nationally televised parades, competitions, and other events, including the Tournament of Roses, Macy's Thanksgiving Parade, the Cotton Bowl Parade, the Orange Bowl, the Fiesta Bowl, and the Peach Bowl. VBHS concert bands have appeared at Carnegie Hall, Music for All in Indianapolis, FMEA Conferences, and other music conferences in Florida, Georgia, Alabama, and South Carolina. During his tenure at VBHS, his bands received Superior Ratings at the FBA Marching MPA (36 years), the FBA District Concert MPA (35 years), and the State Concert MPA (34 years).
