John K. Southall, PhD currently serves as the Chair of the Performing & Visual Arts Department, Director of Bands and Coordinator of Music Education at Indian River State College in Fort Pierce, Florida. Dr. Southall is the Conference Chair for the Florida Music Education Association and music director of the Port St. Lucie Community Band. He serves on the advisory board of the Midwest International Band and Orchestra Conference and is also the sponsor of the Treasure Coast Honor Band & Orchestra Festival (FL).

Dr. Southall has been an active music education advocate, conductor, clinician, performer,

adjudicator, and presenter in the United States for over 39 years. He received the PhD and the MME from Florida State University and the BME from Florida A&M University. He has served on the faculties of Florida State University, the University of Missouri-St. Louis, Nova Southeastern University and Broward Community College. Dr. Southall is a member of the American Bandmasters Association, the Florida Music Education Association, the Florida Bandmasters Association, the College Band Directors National Association, the National Band Association, the National Association for Music Education, the Florida College Music Education Association, Phi Beta Mu, Pi Kappa Lambda,

Kappa Kappa Psi and Tau Beta Sigma.

Dr. Southall is the 2025 recipient of the Florida Music Education Association's Hall of Fame award. He has been honored as a Medal of Honor recipient by the Midwest International Band and Orchestra Conference. He has been honored as a Music Education Legend by the Midwest Clinic. He was awarded the Conference Service Award by the Florida Music Education Association. He is a two-time



recipient of the Indian River State College Endowed Teaching Chair in Fine Arts Award. He has received the Enshrinement Award for Outstanding Contributions to Education by Florida A & M University and was honored in the Gallery of Distinction at Florida A & M University. Dr. Southall was a recipient of the Florida College Music Educator of the Year award by the Florida Music Education Association. He has received the Citation of Excellence by the National Band Association. He has been selected as Teacher of the Month at Indian River State College. He was selected as the Broward County Arts Teacher of the Year (FL), the Western High School Teacher of the Year (FL), and as a finalist for the Broward County Teacher of the Year (FL). He was also the first recipient of the Broward County Band Director of the Year award (FL). Dr. Southall is married to his soul mate, keeper, inspiration, and love of his life, Kelly Southall and has two wonderful daughters - Kathryn and Kimberly, two marvelous sons-in-law, Jacob and David, and six beautiful grandchildren – Neala, Oliver, Juliana, Evelyn, Harley, and David.

Over the past nine years, he has proudly served the Port St. Lucie community, teaching and developing student musicians across several schools and programs.

An active member of Florida's music education scene, Mr. Gabin serves on the Florida Music Education Association's Conference Planning Committee and has coordinated and conducted for regional honor bands. He is a member of FMEA, FBA, Kappa Kappa Psi Alumni Association, and a certified Music Will educator.

Star Spangled Banner Arr. Walter Damrosch & John Philip Sousa

The United States national anthem opens our program with dignity and pride. This classic arrangement by Walter Damrosch and John Philip Sousa enhances the familiar melody with rich harmonies and powerful orchestration. Its enduring message of freedom and resilience sets the tone for today's performance.

Olympic Fanfare and Theme John Williams, arr. James Curnow

John Williams' stirring music for the 1984 Los Angeles Olympic Games captures the spirit of triumph and unity. With soaring brass lines and brilliant percussion, this fanfare has become synonymous with athletic excellence and global celebration. James Curnow's band arrangement brings the grandeur of the Olympics to the concert stage.

Dances in the Canebrakes, III. "Silk Hat and Walking Cane" Florence Price, arr. William Grant Still, trans. D. Brown

Florence Price, the first African American woman to have a symphony performed by a major orchestra, infused her music with rich cultural heritage. This dance from her Dances in the Canebrakes portrays a graceful strut, filled with charm and character. William Grant Still's arrangement highlights syncopation and rhythmic vitality, painting a vivid musical portrait of early 20th-century life.

Rolling Thunder Henry Fillmore, ed. Frederick Fennell

Known as the "Trombone Wizard," Henry Fillmore wrote Rolling Thunder as a showpiece for trombone virtuosity. Rapid-fire articulations, playful slides, and thrilling runs make this circus march an audience favorite. Edited by Frederick Fennell, the piece retains all its dazzling energy while shining a spotlight on the trombone section.

American Panorama Sammy Nestico

Legendary arranger and composer Sammy Nestico paints a sweeping portrait of American life in this vibrant work. Drawing upon jazz idioms, lyrical melodies, and rhythmic vitality, American Panorama captures both the energy and warmth of the nation's diverse musical traditions. The work reflects Nestico's signature style—accessible, colorful, and deeply engaging.

American Hymnsong Suite Dwayne S. Milburn

This powerful suite reimagines classic American hymn tunes through creative scoring and inventive harmonies. From reflective lyricism to triumphant climaxes, Milburn's work balances tradition with fresh energy. Each movement draws upon spiritual depth, offering both performers and listeners a moment of reflection and inspiration.

Red White and Brass Arr. Rayburn Wright, Lee Norris & John Moss

This sparkling medley of American patriotic tunes captures the brilliance of brass and the spirit of celebration. Arranged by Wright, Norris, and Moss, Red White and Brass features bold fanfares, driving rhythms, and familiar melodies that invite audiences to tap their feet and join in the patriotic pride.

El Emoción del Tango Lataydrick Willis Indian River State College Student

Contemporary composer Lataydrick Willis brings the drama and intensity of the tango to the concert band stage. El Emoción del Tango combines sultry rhythms, sweeping lines, and fiery passion, highlighting both elegance and intensity. This modern work celebrates the dance's cultural richness while adding fresh flair and energy.

British Eighth March Zo Elliott

Composed during World War I, British Eighth honors the Allied forces with a spirited and resolute march. Its noble melodies, steady rhythms, and uplifting trio embody courage and perseverance. A staple of military and concert band repertoire, this march remains a stirring tribute to unity and strength.

Star Spangled Spectacular Music of George M. Cohan, arr. John Cacavas

George M. Cohan, known as "the man who owned Broadway," gave America some of its most beloved patriotic tunes. John Cacavas' Star-Spangled Spectacular weaves together favorites like "Yankee Doodle Dandy" and "You're a Grand Old Flag" into a joyful medley, celebrating the exuberance of American song.

Fanfare Prelude on God of Our Fathers Jim Curnow

Based on the well-known hymn God of Our Fathers, Jim Curnow's fanfare prelude combines reverence with majesty. Opening with bold brass proclamations, the work flows into a lyrical setting of the hymn before building to a triumphant finale. It is both a spiritual and celebratory expression of faith and tradition.

The Stars and Stripes Forever John Philip Sousa

Perhaps the most famous American march, Sousa's The Stars and Stripes Forever has been declared the National March of the United States. Its infectious energy, soaring piccolo obbligato, and triumphant brass make it a perennial favorite. The piece is a fitting celebration of American pride and musical heritage.

America the Beautiful Samuel Augustus Ward, arr. Carmen Dragon

This beloved anthem, set to Katharine Lee Bates' poetic text, has become a musical portrait of America's natural beauty and enduring ideals. Carmen Dragon's lush arrangement brings warmth, elegance, and grandeur to the hymn, highlighting expansive harmonies and lyrical phrasing. It is a timeless tribute to the American landscape.

Semper Supra – U.S. Space Force James W. Teachenor/Sean Nelson

"Semper Supra" ("Always Above") is the official song of the United States Space Force. With its bold melodies and soaring harmonies, the piece reflects the pioneering spirit of America's newest military branch. It conveys a sense of adventure, innovation, and honor, saluting those who serve "above and beyond."

Armed Forces Salute Arr. Bob Lowden

This rousing medley honors each branch of the United States Armed Forces with their official songs. Audiences are often invited to stand and be recognized as their service song is played, creating a powerful moment of connection and gratitude. Lowden's arrangement has become a concert tradition across the country.

God Bless America Irving Berlin, arr. John Edmondson

Written by Irving Berlin in 1918 and revised in 1938, God Bless America quickly became one of the nation's most cherished patriotic songs. John Edmondson's arrangement preserves the song's heartfelt simplicity while adding rich sonorities for band. Its hopeful message and memorable melody continue to inspire audiences everywhere.
