# a message from our pastor

Yet more housekeeping. Advent is now concluded and we have arrived at Christmas! The season of Christmas runs from Christmas Day through Epiphany (the almost forgotten Feast Day). So, if you are keeping score at home, the famous 12 Days of Christmas come AFTER the big day and conclude just before Epiphany (Jan 6).

Tradition holds that this is when the wisemen finally made it to Bethlehem. In point of fact, no one really knows, so most manger scenes have the full compliment of characters present. There is room for grace here!

Most of us have a passing acquaintance with epiphany. We understand "epiphany" to be "lightbulb moment." The dictionary the definition is: "a sudden, intuitive perception of or insight into the reality or essential meaning of something, usually initiated by some simple, homely, or commonplace occurrence or experience. a literary work or section of a work presenting, usually symbolically, such a moment of revelation and insight."

Within the church world, Epiphany has a slightly more pointed meaning. understand Epiphany to be the manifestation of Jesus Christ to the Gentiles (that's us!) this is represented by the Magi (Wisemen). non-Jewish travelers/scholars/stargazers from the East observed the star, came to worship and brought interesting gifts.

In the spirit of Epiphany, I hope to clear up a misconception that I've heard a couple of times now. If there are "a couple" - there are probably more, so if you already know about

"Chi-rho" - feel free to skip ahead to the rest of the newsletter. Here's the info.....

I posted a note on my white board at Church about the Wisemen and the Baby Jesus returning to the Creche when we get to "Xmas". I was corrected by folks who thought I was taking Christ out of Christmas. Nay, nay, gentle reader, not at all.

In Greek, the word "Christ" is written as Χριστός. That's chi - rho - iota - sigma - tau -Sigmas are different omicron sigma. depending on whether they are within a word or at the end. The shorthand version is to use a "chi-rho" or just a "chi". An example vou have seen is found on the side of our The large black letters are a buildina. stylized Chi-rho with the rho superimposed upon the Chi. It is not an X-P.... it is a Chirho... an abbreviation for Christ.

So, in the English speaking world, instead of writing out "The Mass of Christ" every time we talk about December 25<sup>th</sup>, we write Christmas - a shorthand version. The even shorter version is to use a capital "chi"... and it looks like Xmas. While I may be lazy, I am certainly not attempting to "take Christ out of Christmas." Hope this helps clarify and "make plain" what those big letters are on the side of the building!!
