a message from our pastor

It has long been noted that if you want to get the attention of a group of Lutherans, you simply say, "**The Lord be with you**." Everyone will stop chatting and respond "*And also with you*." The problem with this trick is that often there is no prayer following the "call and response." All you have are announcements or whatever the leader is trying to convey to the group. It is like a "bait and switch" - you anticipate a prayer, but instead you get an agenda.

"Sharing of the Peace" is not all that dissimilar. You and I (from where we are standing) share God's peace with each other. This is a prayer - a prayer for God's peace to reside with the other person. You will note that there are hand gestures which accompany this prayer. Then, after we have shared this peace, I invite you to share THIS PEACE with one another as we transition into the MEAL. Typically this is done by greeting those immediately around you in front and to each side. "Peace be with you" or "Peace of the Lord" or "God's Peace" is the offer. The response is to repeat the offer or simply respond, "And also with you." There is a gesture which accompanies this prayer (handshake, "praying hands", kiss of peace). Then we are seated.

This is done in preparation for and anticipation of the celebration of Holy Communion. It is a prayer for God's peace to reside with the neighbor. It is not a time for animated or prolonged conversation. It is important and it is done to prepare for Holy Communion. I am all for us being friendly and happy when we greet one another, spend time with one another, get to know one another. This is most appropriately done before or after worship. In worship, our focus is on God and God's Word (written, spoken and living). We receive, share, we carry the gift of God's presence outside the walls of CLC. Called in we are sent forth to go in peace and serve the Lord.

Two other prayer thoughts. Each day I pray for those in our congregation who are in need of prayer and who have requested prayer. Each day I pray for Christ Lutheran Church as a body. Each day. Prayer requires discipline on our part. So when you tell someone, "I'll be praying for you." Do it! Take the time and make the effort to follow through and remember them before God. You don't need to know all the particulars of their medical history or family situation. You don't need to overwhelm God with a verbal assault. Simply commend them to God's care and keeping.

Likewise, our fourth pledge from Thom Rainer's book, <u>I Am A Church Member</u>, is that we will pray for congregation leaders including the Pastor. I am asking for your prayers and also asking that you pray for Teams, Council and one another. No one here is perfect. No one here has all the answers. I can tell you that we all are doing the best that we can and that each and everyone of us needs the support of prayer.

Thom's pledge deals specifically with the pastor. I propose broadening that to include all of us.

"Each day I will pray for my Pastor, congregation leaders, and fellow members.

I will lift them in prayer and seek ways to support them in action.

I will remember to pray for myself. I will pray for a gentle spirit and an open heart."


