We are looking at offering another GriefShare class beginning in September, if there is interest in doing so. I will be taking over this class from Ms. Donalson. So, before I get to the ask, here is some basic information about GriefShare. Because we all need help at some points in our faith journey.

Q How does GriefShare compare with other grief support options?

A While other grief support sites may offer a phone or video consultation with a professional, we have found a group support setting to be crucial for healing. One-on-one counsel is certainly helpful, but a more complete healing is found in the context of having people walk alongside you on the grief journey.

Q How many weeks does the group last?

A GriefShare groups last 13 weeks, and you can begin attending at any time. Everyone is welcome and encouraged to attend the full 13-week group more than once. People have said they find new tips and guidance each time, as they are dealing with new seasons of grieving.

Grief Share's parent ministry is Church Initiative. Church Initiative is a nondenominational, nonprofit ministry serving more than 20,000 churches worldwide. From its headquarters in Wake Forest, North Carolina, the ministry creates and publishes video-based curricula to help churches minister to people experiencing life crises.

Church Initiative is committed to producing small group resources and materials that are Christ-centered, biblically based, and designed for ministry conducted through the local church.

Our mission

Our mission is to equip local churches to mobilize lay ministry teams to help people hurting because of a major life crisis.

If you, are someone you love, is dealing with loss (doesn't have to be recent), please contact the Pam in the Church Office and let us know your name, phone and email. We will compile a list and let you know if the class "makes." We need at least 6 people for a class.

This is a good program for people who need to know and feel that we are not alone as we navigate loss. It is a show of strength to ask for help and to invite others to walk with you through a "season of loss." If you are interested, let us know - and then come and find out how GriefShare can help you and help you to help others!

That's right! Because even as you are hurting, the ability to share that pain can benefit someone else. Just knowing that you "aren't the only one" has tremendous benefits. I hope you will give serious consideration to participating in GriefShare.



Yehiel Curry Elected Presiding Bishop of the ELCA July 30, 2025

PHOENIX — The Rev. Yehiel Curry was elected July 30 to serve a six-year term as presiding bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). The election took place during the 2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly being held July 28–Aug. 2 at the Phoenix (Ariz.) Convention Center.

Curry was elected on the fifth ballot. There were 799 votes cast, with 400 votes needed for an election. Curry received 562 votes, and the Rev. Kevin Strickland, bishop of the ELCA Southeastern Synod, received 237 votes. Curry is the first Black presiding bishop of the ELCA.

Speaking to the assembly after his election, Curry reflected on his membership at Shekinah Chapel in Riverdale, III., where he eventually became a lay mission developer while he participated in the Theological Education for Emerging Ministries program, which prepares individuals for ordained ministry in the ELCA, with a focus on emerging ministry contexts like ethnic-specific, multicultural, rural and inner-city settings. He spoke to the assembly about his initial hesitation in accepting that first ministry role.

"Perhaps I'm out there in one of you," Curry said. "I never saw myself as good enough, so for two years, I said no. I finally said yes. When I said yes, your support, this church's support, of that ministry meant everything. So if you want to know what your benevolence dollars look like, it looks like me, and I want to say thank you. Thank you for your investment."

Curry has served as bishop of the ELCA Metropolitan Chicago Synod since 2019. He previously served as mission developer (2009-2012) and pastor (2012-2019) of Shekinah.

He received a Bachelor of Arts from Lewis University in Romeoville, Ill., in 1995 and a Master of Divinity from the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago (LSTC) in 2013. LSTC is one of seven ELCA seminaries.

The churchwide assembly, the chief legislative authority of the ELCA, is meeting under the theme "For the Life of the World." The assembly will participate in plenary discussions to make decisions about the work of this church. They will also spend time in worship and engage in various ways of theological reflection.

The Jewish Community has 2 upcoming holidays that we are invited to celebrate with them.

Rosh Hashanah is the New Year in Judaism. The biblical name for this holiday is Yom Teruah.

It is the first of the High Holy Days, as specified by Leviticus 23:23–25, that occur in the late summer/early autumn of the Northern Hemisphere.

Rosh Hashanah evening Monday, September 22 at 7 pm Rosh Hashanah morning Tuesday, September 23 at 11 am Yom Kippur is the holiest day of the year in Judaism. It occurs annually on the 10th of Tishrei, corresponding to a date in late September or early October.

For traditional Jewish people, it is primarily centered on atonement and repentance.

Yom Kippur Kol Nidre evening Wednesday, October 1 at 7 pm

Yom Kippur afternoon Thursday, October 2 at 5 pm
The Yom Kippur afternoon service is followed by a dairy
break-the-fast pot luck meal.

Please note that these services are longer than the friday
Shabbat service and are led by a Rabbi.
The services are held in the fellowship area at
Christ Lutheran. If you plan to attend the pot luck meal the
cost is \$15 and we would need to know by September 22nd
that you plan to attend to let the Jewish Congregation know
how much food to plan for.

Dear Beloved Southeastern Synod,



Though I was not called to serve in this new role, I give thanks for our Presiding Bishop-Elect Curry and want to publicly share my prayers and full support for him and his family as they step into this sacred call. We are the body of Christ together, and I will do absolutely all I can to support him and the work ahead, for the sake of the church and the life of the world.

Serving as your bishop continues to be one of the greatest honors of my life. I remain committed to walking with you as we seek to feed and tend God's people in every corner of this synod. May we continue to live into the love Christ has shown us and answer his call with courage and

compassion.


Blessing of the Pets Sponsored by Council of Churches


