






Sunrise in Kenebunk ME

Waves in Bristol, ME




Covered Bridge in Lincoln NH

Notes from your Health and Safety Team




Daylight Saving Time Ends in Tennessee on Sunday, November 6, at 2:00 a.m.. Clocks will be set back one hour.

The National Fire Protection Association has determined that fatalities occur in homes without smoke detectors about twice as frequently as in homes with smoke detectors. While changing the times on your clocks for Daylight Saving Time is an excellent opportunity to also check your home smoke detectors by ensuring that:

- Replacement of older smoke detectors (if more than 10 years old) as recommended by the Fairfield Glade Fire Department (<u>Fire Prevention | Fairfield Glade FD (fairfieldgladefire.org)</u>)
- 2. They are securely fastened to the wall or ceiling,
- 3. The detectors have no evidence of physical damage, paint application or excessive grease and dirt accumulations,
- 4. The ventilation holes on the smoke alarm are clean and free of obstructions, and
- 5. The smoke alarm signal sounds when the test button is pushed.




