a message from our pastor

I recently received an early Christmas present from a dear saint in our congregation. It is a book which will be making more appearances in the weeks and months to come. The book is **Wholehearted Faith** by the late Rachel Held Evans (author, columnist, blogger). Rachel died in 2019 far too soon. Jeff Chu worked to bring this book into being based upon uncompleted work which Rachel Held Evans left behind.

I read this work while I was recently at LTSS for meetings. It was and is powerful. I share with you now a little taste as we move into Advent. Here are her words:

"I know that Christians are Easter people. We are supposed to favor the story of the resurrection, which reminds us that death is never the end of God's story. Yet I have never found that story even half as compelling as the story of the Incarnation.

It is nearly impossible to believe: God shrinking down to the size of a zygote, implanted in the soft lining of a woman's womb. God growing fingers and toes. God kicking and hiccupping <u>in utero</u>. God inching down the birth canal and entering this world covered in blood, perhaps into the steady, waiting arms of a midwife. God crying out in hunger. God reaching for his mother's breasts. God totally relaxed, eyes closed, his chubby little arms raised over his head in a posture of complete trust. God resting in his mother's lap.

On the days and nights when I believe this story that we call Christianity, I cannot entirely make sense of the storyline: God's trusted God's very self, totally and completely and in full bodily form to the care of a woman. God needed women for survival. Before Jesus fed us with the bread and the wine, the body and the blood, Jesus himself needed to be fed, by a woman. He needed a woman to say: "This is my body, given for you." God became vulnerable. (page 4ff) "

That is some powerful writing!! That makes Advent new and accessible and alive. As we move into another Advent season, may we capture that sense of newness and wonder and possibility. It is so easy to become numb to the wonder. We've heard the story before. We know how it ends. May this year be an opportunity to encounter newness in the "old, old story."

We will use Marty Haugen's "Holden Even Prayer" for our midweek services. You've heard it in edited form - now you will encounter it as written. It is old and yet strangely new. The singable melodies will transport you through the weeks of Advent to encounter the vulnerable God coming to us again. Thanks to Joy and the choir for leading this effort.

The Bob Johnson Players are also returning this year after a COVID imposed hiatus. Thanks to Heidi and "the players." I am excited to hear them take us through the weeks of Advent with brief dramatic vignettes.

As we begin another Advent journey, may we capture the sense of wonder and possibility that permeates this season. May we carry the wonder and possibility forward throughout the coming year.
