a message from our pastor

On Ash Wednesday, we experience one of the most powerful services within the life of the Church. We come to the Communion Rail two times. We come the first time and are reminded in graphic form of our own mortality as the grit of ash moves across our forehead retracing the cross made at our baptism. "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return."

Then we return a second time to encounter Christ in the Holy Communion. We hear words of life, not death. We hear words which pulls us forward into the future that God is creating. Beyond the reality of mortality is the gift of new life in and with Christ. With ashes still marking our foreheads, we receive the promise of new life. Death is very real, but it is not the final word.

Throughout the season of Lent, we will be using a "new" midweek service. New in quotes because it is new to us, but it has been around a while. Marty Haugen's *Unfailing Light*. It is an absolutely beautiful work which captures the themes of Ash Wednesday and carries us forward through Holy Week and Easter. As we gather for Vespers, we gather with the assurance that Christ is present and active among us.

The Hymn after Communion is particularly poignant and lifts up our 2022 theme of community. I commend it to you as we begin another Lenten Journey.

"By your hand you feed your people, food of angels, heaven's bread; for these gifts we did not labor, by your grace have we been fed:

Christ's own body, blessed and broken,

cup o'er-flowing life outpoured,

given as a living token of your world redeemed, restored.

In this meal we taste your sweetness, bread for hunger, wine of peace; holy Word and holy wisdom satisfy our deepest needs.

Christ's own body, blessed and broken cup o'er-flowing life outpoured, given as a living token of your world redeemed, restored.

Send us now with faith and courage to the hungry, lost, bereaved.
In our living and our dying, we become what we receive:

Christ's own body, blessed and broken

cup o'er-flowing life outpoured,

given as a living token of your world redeemed, restored."



I hope all of you are having a great March and Valentine's Day was special for many of you. The weather has been up and down but beautiful spring days are coming.

I want to thank all of you that attended the Congregational Meeting on March 13, 2022 for your patience and understanding. I had a few stumbles along the way, but I hope to get better for all future meetings. If you were not able to attend, you missed a great lunch with food provided by many in the congregation and set up by Pat Bock and the Fellowship Team. Thank you all!

The following is a quick summary of the meeting.

- Financials continue to be strong.
- New Property Team Leader effective March 15 Steven Brown
- Property Projects
 - Eight new commercial grade toilets installed February 17 \$4,050
 - New lighting at the Fellowship entrance the end of March \$2,000
 - New closet in Pastor's office in May \$600 which includes some minor renovation in Pastor Doug's old office
- <u>Wellness Team</u> dissolved effective March 15; Property will pick up their duties until a new Health and Safety Team is formed (there is a special request in *Life Lines* for a team leader to take this important role on with responsibilities)
- <u>CPR/Defibrillator Training</u> will occur in March with a 3-hour session at Legends for up to 15 people. A signup sheet is on the Activities bulletin board.
- <u>Purchasing a New Defibrillator</u> replacing the existing unit cost \$1,200; the older unit will be moved to the Fellowship Hall. The number of groups using the Fellowship Hall now and with the Lion's Club starting soon, a unit should be provided in that area. Outside groups will be responsible for their own training.
- Surplus funds \$2,000 set aside for Christ Lutheran Church Director of Music for two possible events in 2022
- Gatherings 2022
 - Building Bridges starting in March (contact Craig Christen)
 - Via de Cristo in April
 - Annual Memorial Golf Tournament in September
 - Fellowship Events throughout the year
 - Stephen Ministry
- Bread of Life monthly luncheon needs help

As you can see, many exciting things are planned moving forward in 2022. I again thank CLC Leadership/Council over the last two plus years dealing with COVID and all the other areas of concern to get us to this point.

Please do not loose sight that COVID is still out there. Use common sense practices attending activities.
