a message from our pastor

A few years ago, in CLC, a little book was given to new members of the congregation. I believe that practice may be making a comeback! President Deierlein referenced this book in last month's Council devotion. I share it with you now because the basic theme of engagement and action marry well with the Easter proclamation.

We do not whisper this proclamation. We do not keep this proclamation in a vault to be admired on special occasions. We share through word and deed, as often as possible, as loudly as possible, the amazing Good News of Easter. **"He is Risen. He is risen, indeed! Alleluia."**

While the post-Resurrection experiences are all different, the one commonality they share is the profound and life-altering effect which they had upon the person encountering the risen Christ. Reactions vary, but no one was the same after this experience. This reality remains true!

The little book I mentioned earlier is entitled, "I Am A Church Member" by Thom S. Rainer. There are several "pledges" which we will look at over the coming months. I share with you the first suggested pledge as we move toward greater excitement and engagement on all our parts. Excitement over what God has given, provided and revealed to us. Engagement with the ministry entrusted to each and to all. We are not ministry consumers, you and I, we are ministry providers! That is both gift and obligation. Here is the beginning pledge:

"I like the metaphor of membership. It's not membership as in a civic organization or a country club. it's the kind of membership given to us in 1 Corinthians 12: "Now you are the body of Christ, and individual members of it (1 Cor 12:27). Because I am a member of the body of Christ, I must be a functioning member, whether I am an "eye," or an "ear," or a "hand."

**As a functioning member,
I will give.
I will serve.
I will minister.
I will evangelize.
I will study.
I will seek to be a blessing to others.
I will remember that "if one member suffers, all the members suffer with it;
if one member is honored, all the members rejoice with it" (1 Cor 12:26).**

A most appropriate place to start!! We are gifted and we are graced. We are constantly seeking to find ways to share that gift and grace with our brothers and sisters. In baptism we are claimed, gathered and sent to be of service. Let us begin by sharing the proclamation which unites us all:



EASTER VIGIL

The Merriam-Webster dictionary defines vigil as "the act of keeping awake at times when sleep is customary" and "a period of wakefulness." You may have heard the word vigil on TV shows where a community is mourning a loss (or losses) by gathering in the evening with candles to remember and honor the loss and support each other.

The Easter (or "Paschal") Vigil is a bit different as it marks a transition from dark into light, despair to hope, spiritual emptiness to spiritual newness. It is the celebration of Christ's resurrection and the redemptive gift He has given the world. The Easter Vigil marks the end of Lent.

Not all churches practice the tradition of an Easter Vigil, as it is mainly observed in liturgical denominations of Christianity such as Lutheran, Anglican, Catholic, and Orthodox. Liturgical churches include a set structure and ritual for worship that generally follows the church calendar year. Many non-denominational, Baptist, and charismatic branches of Christianity only observe Good Friday (commemorating Christ's crucifixion) and Easter Sunday (commemorating Christ's resurrection). The Easter Vigil observes the transition from the darkness of Holy Saturday (the day after Good Friday) to the joy of Easter Sunday (excluding Oriental Orthodoxy). [<https://412teens.org>]

The Service of Light: There is a "new fire" made outside of the regular worship space. The Pascal Candle is lit and blessed for use during the new year. The procession moves into the regular worship space where the Easter Proclamation is made. "This is the night...". The Service of Light concludes with the Prayer of the Day.

The Liturgy of the Word: or Service of Readings. Here the history of Salvation is recounted using Old Testament readings. The number of readings can vary from four to twelve. After the Old Testament readings, there is a New Testament reading from Romans and a Gospel reading.

The Liturgy of Baptism: Next is The Liturgy of Baptism or if there is no Baptism scheduled, Affirmation of Baptism by the assembly. Our Grandson Klaus was an Easter Vigil Baptism a few years ago! Historically, this was the main time for baptism as the candidates had been preparing throughout the season of Lent. All of us give thanks for our inclusion into the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ - a resurrection poignantly celebrated this night!

The Liturgy of the Eucharist: The Easter Vigil ends on a celebration of the Eucharist or Holy Communion. As we discussed a few weeks ago, we are now "on the third day" and celebrating the Resurrection is most appropriate. While not the bombastic, pull out all the stops type of worship service we will encounter Easter morning, this celebration is very much in keeping with the muted excitement which Mary experienced at the tomb.

While Easter Vigil is "new" to our congregation, it is one of the oldest liturgical services we have. I look forward to celebrating this service with you.

Barrel Ministry for April, 2022

The AVALON Center is our barrel ministry for April. This 24-hour emergency temporary shelter ensures survivors of Domestic and Sexual Assault and their dependents an environment that provides a foundation for independence. Each shelter resident will have access to a case manager to provide additional services.

In 1984, the Battered Women, Inc. began as a grassroots movement. In 2002 their name changed to Avalon Center in order to reflect the broad spectrum of services they now provide. They serve 7 counties: Bledsoe, Cumberland, Fentress, Morgan, Rhea, Roane and Van Buren.

The mission of the Avalon Center is to end power-based violence against men, women, children in the communities we serve with the goal of achieving social justice.

Their needs include:

- * Children's diapers, wipes, formulas
- * Paper products: paper towels, tissues, toilet paper,
- * Cleansers: disinfectant wipes, bleach, laundry soap, dryer towels, soap, shampoo, razors, deodorants, etc.



What an amazing non-profit. They also offer Court Advocacy, Safety Planning, Financial Advocacy, Employment Advocacy, Medical Advocacy, Transitional Housing Program, Child and Youth Program, Support Groups, Professional Counseling and Material Assistance.



How Do I Volunteer for BOL?

There is a sign up sheet on the service bulletin board every month. Volunteering to help with Bread of Life can be as simple as:

- ◇ Leader selects menu and keeps track of food
- ◇ Driver picks up food at church on second Sunday and delivers to BOL
- ◇ Pick an item you would like to bring and sign the sheet to let the leader know what is expected. Provide that food item, bread, salad, veggie, main dish, or dessert. You can select the item from the menu provided then either buy it or make it and deliver it to church by Sunday morning. The item should serve 15 people.

We serve this lunch once a month on the second Sunday. If many volunteer, you might bring one item once or twice a year. This is an easy and always rewarding service.

SAFETY PROGRAMS

Two safety programs are available for your use.

- The **Vial of Life Kit** records health concerns and medications. One vial goes in your freezer and the other in the glove box of your vehicle.
- **Yellow Dot Program** requires a photo and medical information. The yellow dot is on the outside of your vehicle to alert emergency personnel to the information inside.

These programs are vital when seconds count. All information and instructions are included in the packets. The packets can be found in a basket in the Narthex.
