a message from our pastor

Alleluia! He is Risen!! He is risen, indeed. Alleluia! The joyous proclamation thunders through the Church. The lights are blazing. The hymns are rocking. The pews are packed. Easter is here and we will sail along on Eastertide until the Feast of Pentecost. 50 days of Easter. So now what?

Jesus' answer to those disciples soon to be Apostles? Stewardship. If Easter is not simply one day (Easter falls on the first Sunday after the Full Moon date, based on mathematical calculations, that falls on or after March 21. If the Full Moon is on a Sunday, Easter is celebrated on the following Sunday) but rather a season; Stewardship is not simply financial, but rather a response involving Time, Talent and Treasure.

After the Crucifixion and before the boys get a handle on Jesus' Resurrection, they attempt to go back to business as usual... the way they had always done it. Jesus would have none of that. As part of the redemption or reclamation of Peter, Jesus lays out very clearly a Stewardship campaign for the Early Church. Feed my lambs - Tend my sheep - Feed my sheep.

For people who profess love for the risen and ruling Christ, our response is given to us. The expectation of Stewardship is laid upon each of us. Feed - Tend - Feed. Stewardship is not simply an event in November, it is a lifelong response to the mind-bending good news of Jesus' Resurrection. And that response is a full-body response. Our Stewardship response involves wallets.... and hearts, minds, hands, brains, feet, mouth.... well, you get the idea. Stewardship is not simply a campaign, it is a way of life and a response of faith.

In chapter 2 of the book I mentioned last month, Thom S. Rainer talks about the second pledge of the church member. The way I read it, he is talking about Stewardship - how will I respond to the grace of God present in Christ my Lord?

Here it is: **"I will seek to be a source of unity in my church. I know there are no perfect pastors, staff, or other church members. But neither am I. I will not be source of gossip or dissension. One of the greatest contributions I can make is to do all I can in God's power to help keep the church in unity for the sake of the gospel."**

As we each continue through these 50 days of Easter, let us focus on how we can build up, urge on and help out our brothers and sisters in faith. Individually and corporately, we commit ourselves to a life of faithful stewardship. Individually and corporately we commit ourselves to Tend the lambs of Christ - Feed the sheep of Christ - Tend the sheep of Christ. And in doing this, our love is displayed for all to see.

Alleluia! He is Risen
He is risen, indeed. Alleluia.

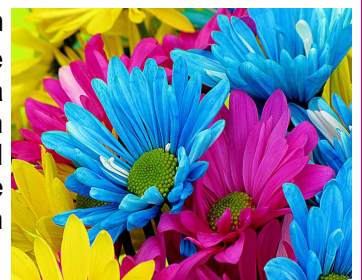

Plateau Pregnancy is dedicated to helping men and women of all ages overcome life's circumstances and past choices so that they can provide life for their babies and children. They are supported by donations from individuals, business partners and area churches.

Every May, around Mother's Day, baby bottles appear from Plateau Pregnancy to fill up by our members. These banks are returned around Father's Day. The bottles have slots for coins, bills and/or checks.

This project offers: free pregnancy tests, confidential and compassionate care, material assistance, parenting, CPR, healthy pregnancy, and labor and delivery classes and education, and assistance getting connected to other resources available in our community.

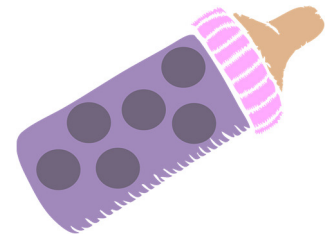

- The **Vial of Life Kit** records health concerns and medications. One vial goes in your freezer and the other in the glove box of your vehicle.
- **Yellow Dot Program** requires a photo and medical information. The yellow dot is on the outside of your vehicle to alert emergency personnel to the information inside.

These programs are vital when seconds count. All information and instructions are included in the packets. The packets can be found in a basket in the Narthex.
