a message from our pastor

There truly are no “coincidences” in the economy of God. This month we celebrate the Festival of Pentecost (the Birthday of the Church) and we continue on in this delightful book, “I Am a Church Member” by Thom S. Rainer. The third pledge is amazingly apropos. The third chapter is entitled, “I Will Not Let My Church Be about My Preferences and Desires.” In our day and age, this is a difficult chapter, and it is a necessary chapter. The first disciples had trouble with this concept arguing about who would be the greatest.

We all too often forget that we gather together for worship and service. Worship of God and service of neighbor. I try to model the behavior that I believe is expected of each of us (part of our Baptismal Covenant). I provide pastoral care within our congregation to be sure. That is one of my primary responsibilities, but part of my call to Christ Lutheran Church is to serve the larger community. I do this through the Council of Churches, C5 Board of Directors, the Lion’s Club, volunteering as Chaplain at Cumberland Medical Center and hopefully at the Fairfield Glade Police Department. I have also assumed teaching responsibility for in-person GriefShare and that is also why I serve on Synodical committees.

We do not simply look inward, but outward. Our ministry flows through the congregation to the local community and then on through the Synod and the ELCA. We continually look for ways to be of service not just to “our people,” but to all people. That is the way stewardship works. We are claimed, gathered and sent. We are brought in and nourished - then sent out to be of service to a world in need.

So as we celebrate the Birthday of the Church - the Festival of Pentecost - let us continue to turn our gaze outward as our stewardship flows through Christ Lutheran Church to a world in need. Here is the third pledge:

What we as your church council are trying to do is also be consistent in how we inform you on all projects and issues at Christ Lutheran.

The church council met on May 12 and the following were discussed:

- ◆ Craig Christen spoke to council about the sound system and live streaming. Special thank you to Bill Kerr for helping us contact local sound expert, Allan Rumbaugh. We will receive a quote from him on time and equipment and training. Craig visited St. Francis to see what they do and we will continue to speak to Dr. Harris and schedule Clair Global to give us their opinions. Comcast will be out as of June 14 and Ben Loman Company will take over. Thanks to all who serve in the Sound Booth and Karl Knebel.
- ◆ Alarm System—We had a lightening strike a month ago. We were told they would replace the panel board. Unfortunately, the whole system was affected and we now must replace the entire system. The insurance company will pay for the replacement less the \$1,000. deductible. We hope to be operational by April 23.
- ◆ Other:
 - ◇ Pastoral Chairs. Four special chairs installed on May 12. Thanks to Greg Paul, Glen House and Gary Deierlein for assembly.
 - ◇ Bell Storage Cabinet should be completed by August 1.
 - ◇ Parking Lot quotes are being received.
 - ◇ New Lawn Service started May 11.
 - ◇ Columbarium information being gathered and quotes requested.
 - ◇ Insurance Coverage replacement coverage for the building was increased to \$2,900,000 from \$2,524,000; contents and columbarium are being evaluated.
 - ◇ Table in Narthex was given by new members Doreen Morris, Graham Kneale and Anook. It is beautiful. If you haven't seen it, please look in front of the stained glass windows.
 - ◇ Peace and Unity Music Program is scheduled for June 12 at 6:00 p.m.
 - ◇ Golf Tournament benefitting Fairfield Glade Resident Services on September 18 beginning at 1:00 p.m.

NEW PROCEDURE FOR FRESH ALTAR FLOWERS

The church was just informed of a substantial price increase from the florist. This increase, along with declining flower donations prompted the Worship and Music team to discuss the future of the flowers. The team suggested and the Church Council approved the discontinuation of fresh flowers.

Starting June 1 we will utilize the brass vases for artificial flowers for the Sanctuary. These will change with the seasons. We will still have fresh flowers at Christmas and Easter.

A form will be available on the Narthex bulletin board to fill out for any celebrations or remembrances. Deposit the forms in the office in the envelope marked "Announcement Forms." They will then be put in the bulletin and announced by the Pastor, as we did with flowers.

This does not affect funerals/memorials and weddings. Anyone involved in those occasions will still take care of the flowers themselves.

If someone would like to still donate fresh flowers, they must take care of it themselves utilizing one of our brass vase metal inserts. Florist arrangements **only** may be put in these.

We hope the money that was used to purchase fresh flowers will be used to donate to the multitude of worthy causes that are always in need. Also, remember that you may donate to the flower fund anytime to purchase flowers for Christmas and Easter and to update the artificial arrangements.

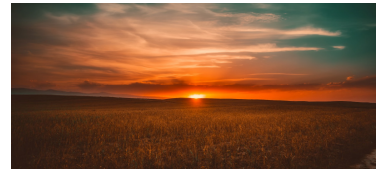
Dear CLC Friends -

The purpose is to ensure that the principal balance lasts in perpetuity.

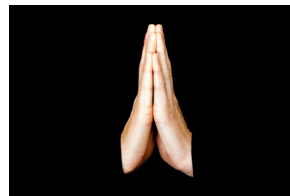
