TABLE TALK comes to CLC and Fairfield Glade! Such a deal.....

Here is how the Fairfield Glade version of "Table Talk" will work. First about the name. Martin Luther and the students living in his home used to hang out and discuss a wide range of topics. Some enterprising soul wrote down some of these unstructured chats. Seemed like a good model for us to use - at least the non-structured, discussion oriented part!

You can find any number of free versions of Luther's Small Catechism. There is a Small Catechism contained in ELW. If you want to make notes and jot questions, it is probably better to download your own copy!! Here is one I downloaded and will use in class. The precise text is not really that important. I want us to discuss the broad issues and not specific translation issues. Martin Luther's

It would be helpful if you read the material ahead of time. I look forward to spending some time working through this discipline with you!
