

WE HEAR GOD'S WORD

Litany of the Advent Candle (Joy)

The Moyseenko Family

One: Divine Delight, in you we are gifted the wonder of joy.

All: We praise you for joy's abundance all over creation.

One: It is there in a baby elephant playing in ocean waves, a family pet's greeting upon their return home, a bear relaxing in someone's backyard hammock.

All: And joy time travels, too. It is present in fond memories and excitement for future possibilities.

One: Yet, in times when we find ourselves feeling far from joy, how might this Advent wreath accompany us in such moments?

All: Perhaps it is in the simple act of lighting a candle together as a community, around the possibility of joy.

One: Perhaps it is in kindling it through noticing even the slightest warmth touch our heart when we witness joy in others. So let us gather around and light this candle with God's cosmic light,

All: a light that bends and moves and fills beyond the joy that we thought was full. Amen.

Scripture Reading Luke 3:7-18

⁷ John said to the crowds who came out to be baptized by him, "You pack of snakes! Who warned you to escape the wrath to come? ⁸ Produce good fruit as a sign of your repentance. And don't presume to say to yourselves, 'We have Sarah and Abraham as our mother and father,' for I tell you that God can raise children for Sarah and Abraham from these very stones. ⁹ The ax is already laid at the root of the tree; every tree that doesn't produce good fruit will be cut down and tossed into the fire." ¹⁰ When the people asked him, "What should we do?" ¹¹ John replied, "Let the one with two coats share with the one who has none. Let those who have food do the same." ¹² Tax collectors also came to be baptized, and they said to John, "Teacher, what are we to do?" ¹³ John answered them, "Exact nothing over and above your fixed amount." ¹⁴ Soldiers likewise asked, "What about us?" John told them, "Don't bully anyone. Don't accuse anyone falsely. Be content with your pay." ¹⁵ The people were full of anticipation, wondering in their hearts whether John might be the Messiah. ¹⁶ John answered them all by saying, "I am baptizing you in water, but someone is coming who is mightier than I, whose sandals I am not fit to untie! This One will baptize you in the Holy Spirit and in fire. ¹⁷ A winnowing-fan is in his hand to clear the threshing floor and gather the wheat into the granary, but the chaff will be burnt in unquenchable fire." ¹⁸ Using exhortations like this, John proclaimed the Good News to the people.
