<u>From the Pastor</u> – Pastor Kearstin (she/her)

Hello Beloveds! Over the last month, we've been talking in bible study about our theological stories — what our families and churches taught us about God, as well as how those beliefs have shifted as we've lived our lives. In our online group, I asked folks, "Have you ever been singing a hymn or secular song and had a negative response to the imagery or language? How do you respond when the images and language in a song conflict with your theology?"

It got me thinking about worship a few weeks ago when we sang hymn #436, *Jesu, Jesu, Fill Us with Your Love*. I chose the hymn because I got the refrain stuck in my head one morning and couldn't stop humming it! But when we began to sing the song as a congregation, I was shocked — this hymn uses some really problematic "master" and "slave" language to describe our relationship to God. The blood drained from my face and I was so embarrassed that I had mistakenly chosen a song so antithetical to my own personal theology! Eek! In the moment, I changed the words to the song as I sang and hoped for the best.

I'll admit, it was not my finest pastoral moment! But this got me thinking — did you know that you can always change the language to a hymn or a reading during our worship together? I mean it! If a hymn says "Lord" and you would rather sing "God", go for it! When we sing the Gloria Patri after the scripture, feel free to change "Father" to "Creator"! The same goes for the Lord's Prayer, the Doxology, and any of the other pieces of liturgy we read on a Sunday morning.

One of the things that I love most about the UCC is that we are a denomination that doesn't use creeds. There is no one set of beliefs that you **have to** agree with in order to be part of this church. Members and visitors at FCC come from a wide variety of religious backgrounds and hold theological beliefs all across the spectrum.

When I write the liturgy and craft each Sunday's worship experience, I try to use expansive and loving language — but it's not always going to resonate with everyone, and that's okay. No matter what words we say, we praise God well by simply joining together in intentional community; if

tweaking a few words helps you to feel more settled, empowered, and connected to the worship experience, then please do so! And let me know what changes you make — I would love to hear from you about the words for God that make your soul come alive!
