## <u>Trustees' Turn</u> – Roy Dreger

I'm sure you are aware that the trustees are trying to put together a capital campaign. You may also be aware that the going has been slow. However, there are still some things that the trustees have accomplished.

The rear entryway of the church (under the overhang) has been a security issue for a long time. The light was only on when the switch was thrown, so the area beneath the overhang was dark during night hours when no one was using the building. The trustees wanted a dusk to dawn fixture, but there were problems trying to adapt the light that was there. (The fixture that was there had an integrated LED ring light which could not be replaced.) The trustees decided to replace the entire fixture that was there with a fixture that used a replaceable bulb, that way we could utilize a bulb with a built-in dusk to dawn sensor. The new fixture is in and so far, seems to be working.

In regards to replacing the sidewalk along the east side of the sanctuary, it seems that there is a possible problem. The person I asked to look at it stated that since it was adjacent to the parking lot, the specifications might be different from a "normal" sidewalk, like one in front of your house. The big difference is in the amount of concrete needed. The city's building department was contacted but the issue is still unclear. Maybe the building department will take a look at it.

Currently we are talking with the painter to try and work out the dates and times to repair the ceiling above the organ where there is some damage from a roof leak. It is necessary that someone be at the church while the work is being done. This is a busy time of the year for everyone, and this includes the painters and the trustees, so finding the times that everyone involved is available can get complicated.

The trustees have asked West Side Roofing to work with our insurance company to see about getting the roof over the school wing replaced. West Side has done work on our sanctuary roof, and their work has been good so far. Not every company can do slate roofs, but West Side has that ability. Since they had done work for us, it was an easy decision to ask them to take the lead on this.

The Board of Trustees needs more board members. Currently we have four, and if someone can't make the meeting we are down to three. There needs to be more board members to help with the finances and building repairs. None of us are experts, and that is one reason why we need additional people and their input. Please consider joining the trustees. The only

requirement is that you must be an active church member.

I know it must sound repetitive, but your financial contributions help support this congregation and its various ministries. We thank you for your continued support.
