The Outreach Committee is doing many small things this month to make a difference in our community and beyond. We have updated our homebound list and continue to send cards monthly to those in our church who are unable to attend services. We have a new family we are sponsoring through Community Care and provided birthday party items and a gift card for one child's 8<sup>th</sup> birthday in May.

We voted to give Community Care an extra \$200 in June for its summer lunch program, in addition to the \$100 we contribute monthly. There is a bin and a list of items requested by Community Care in the Sunday School hallway. Items include cleaning supplies, personal hygiene items, and paper products. Please check to see if there is something on the list that you can contribute to help out. We earmarked \$300 to Christian Ed for the youth mission trip, as well as \$100 to donate directly to the Lotts Creek school.

Our "Dine to Donate" event at the Avon Applebee's is on Wednesday, June 5. Flyers to present at the restaurant for a 15% donation to our church are available at church and in this newsletter. We hope you are able to participate in this event, the proceeds of which will also support the youth mission trip.

The One World Shop wishes to thank all of you for your purchases at its mobile shop here at church to support its work. Your contributions to One Great Hour of Sharing totaled \$218.00. We collected in

May for the UCC Strengthen the Church "On Holy Ground" campaign. Among other things, the monies collected support UCC conferences, establishing new churches, and youth ministry.

### <u>Trustees' Turn</u> – Roy Dreger

If you read last month's column then you are pretty much up to speed on where we stand as regards getting quotes for our proposed capital campaign. It seems harder than it should be to get the responses we need to finalize plans. We hope to have all the information we need to start the campaign in July, but that is entirely dependent on companies getting back to us. Even with phone calls for updates, responses are slow in coming.

There are a few things that we have been able to accomplish. It was decided to try to find a way to keep the rear entrance under the overhang lit during the night hours. We need to investigate the current light fixture to see how best to accomplish that. Also, we approved the purchase of an air conditioner for the pastor's office (the window is not your common double-hung style and is an unusual size). We are changing pest control providers which will save the church a few hundred dollars every year; and, while this is not a large sum, every dollar counts!

The annual "Spring Clean-Up" day is coming on June 8 so gather your shovels and rakes and other items of destruction and join us beginning at 9:00 am as we work to beautify the grounds. As the late Bob Gilder, a long-time member of the church, once said "Make the old girl look good!" If you can't work outdoors, I'm sure there are things that can be found to do inside.
