Scripture Focus:

“He was wounded for our transgressions; He was bruised for our iniquities.” — Isaiah 53:5 (KJV)

Devotional Thought

*“When His wounded hands touch mine,
when His wounded hand touch mine,
my Jesus set me free from all eternity,
oh when His wounded hand touch mine.”*

There is something deeply sacred about the image of Jesus’ wounded hands. The scars He carries are not marks of weakness, but eternal signs of love. They tell the story of a Savior who entered human suffering and bore it willingly so that we might know freedom, healing, and life everlasting.

At **Greater Deliverance Church of God Ministries**, we are reminded that the same hands that healed the sick, lifted the broken, and blessed the children are the hands that were pierced for our redemption.

A Touch That Transforms
