

Using Microsoft Teams to create and teach an online class:

Microsoft Teams is an online communication and collaboration platform included within your schools Office 365 for education subscription plan.

Prior to using Teams it would be useful to familiarise yourself with some of the concepts in the "how-to" guidance videos found at the end of this document.


Step 1 – Log into Office 365 and Open Teams:

Launch your web browser and sign into Office 365 at the following address:


nb – you can log directly into teams at http://teams.microsoft.com

From the Office 365 Applications Portal choose Teams



Teams will open in a new tab of your internet browser – take a moment to familiarise yourself with it's layout. Note that the layout looks slightly different for Students as a few options have been restricted around instant messaging for those users.


Navigation Menu






Step 2 - Create an Online Classroom Space:

From the Navigation Menu select "Teams" and then click on "Create a Team"






Now select to create a "Class" Team



Give your Class a name and description – call it whatever you would in school (eg Yr 11 Maths) then click on "Next"





Once you have created the class you'll be prompted to add Students and Teachers. Since it's you who has created it you will automatically be added as an owner of the Team so there is no need to add yourself.

Add people to "My Test Team"

Students Teachers

Search for students

Start typing a name to choose a group, distribution list or person at your school.

Notice that there is an area for you to add other Teachers or Support Staff who can also be supervisors of the Team.


When you have finished adding pupils and staff to the team – click "Close"

Step 3 – Set up channels (topics) for your class team:

Just as with a real class this online one allows you to split out separate topics or areas for focus – this is done through the "Channels" feature. For instance a Maths class might require a trigonometry channel as well as algebra and fractions channels.

A "General" channel for the class will be created automatically – but you can add your own relevant to the class as follows:

Click on the three dots to the right of your teams name and choose "add channel"



When specifying the settings for the channel use a sensible name and for "privacy" decide whether all members of the class should see this team or only some. Tick the box to make the team available to the students and then click on Add.
