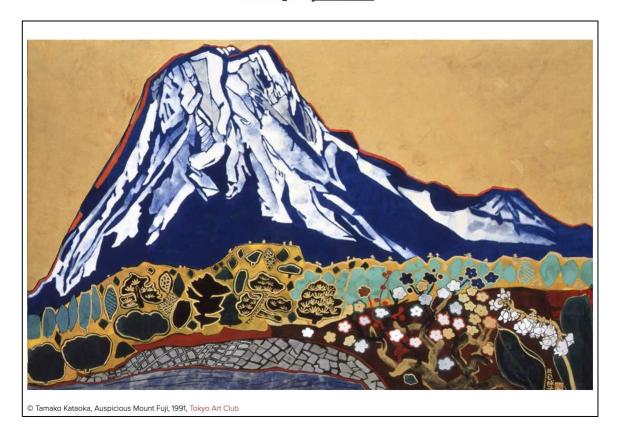

Karate Perspectives

San-Kyu

ど手には先手無

The teaching that I have been working with the most over the last few months has been the idea that, "In karate, there is no first strike." Or, in Japanese: 空手には先手無し (karate ni wa sente nashi).

What does it mean to study a martial art from a mental and philosophical orientation such as this one, which reminds us that preemptive violence – the 'first strike' – violates the essence of what it means to be a practitioner of karate, the 'empty hand' that moves through life without a weapon?

As I practice kata and as I train oyotanren, I have been taking a moment before beginning each repetition to take stock of the fact that the first thing I will do is to block, rather than to strike.

As I practice kata and as I train oyotanren, I have been taking a moment at the end to take stock of the fact that the last thing I will do, before bowing, is usually, once again, to block or to parry or, as at the end of fukyūgata 2, to survey the space with my fist out in front of me, placed upon my open palm.

As I practice kata and as I train oyotanren and prearranged, I have come to think of each strike, too, as an invitation to my imaginary opponent. The invitation is to be done fighting. The invitation is to see one another as someone worth bowing to.

Ni-Kyu

Although I had heard of how things change when you're a brown belt I didn't quite understand what that meant until I recently got mine. Having passed other tests before, I thought I knew the feeling of learning new kata and having more responsibility but this promotion feels different. The naihanchi kata are much different from anything I have done. Previously, I relied on direction to help me remember the moves but naihanchi keeps your body facing forward and I'm having to rethink the way I memorize.

I have started handling bo which requires a whole different mindset. Up until now I have always been told to make a tight fist, keep your fingers together, and make sure your hand could break boards. This is no longer the case and it feels very vulnerable not to have my hands to hit with. Instead I have to channel that energy into a weapon and rely on that weapon to do what my hands cannot.

Finally I have begun to understand what it means to truly be a teacher. Although I do not have nearly as much experience as the black belts in my dojo, I now have a better respect for what they do. Until now the focus has often been helping me and making sure I get to work my kata. But now, I don't always get to do that. Sometimes I work in groups with junior ranks or teach new students. I have learned so much more about my karate through this. By knowing that people are watching me, and copying me during workouts it forces me to work harder. I am excited to see how earning this new belt helps me improve my karate and makes me train even harder.

Ni-Kyu

- A few classes after I first started doing karate, I realized that karate becomes a part of one's life if they choose to embrace it. Every night after a karate class I always had this really good feeling of accomplishment, but I feel that Karate totally became a part of me while I was in Florida.
- The Florida training really pushed me to try harder and learn more through trial and error. One really beneficial thing about the Florida trip was there were back-to-back classes where you could get more repetitions of what you learned before therefore making it even better.
- My favorite kata is probably fukyugata san because it is all about the difference in height. This kata, I feel, is so powerful and has a lot of room to get better.
- Cat stance always just seemed like a place to me, until one of the Sensei in Florida helped me by saying this, "Imagine a bubble of water in front of you. Cut that bubble in two."
- To prepare for testing, I tried to focus on mainly harnessing my power. Sometimes I tend to go too hard and too fast and I will sometimes hurt myself or tire quickly. In Florida they were always stressing how important it is to breathe in between every move in order to stay focused and calm. This piece of advice greatly helped.
- I know that being a brown belt is going to be a lot harder than being a green belt, but I am ready to try my hardest!

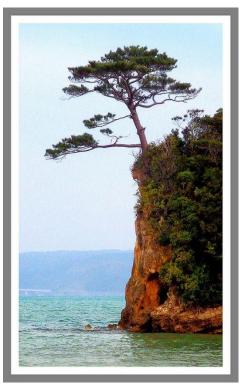

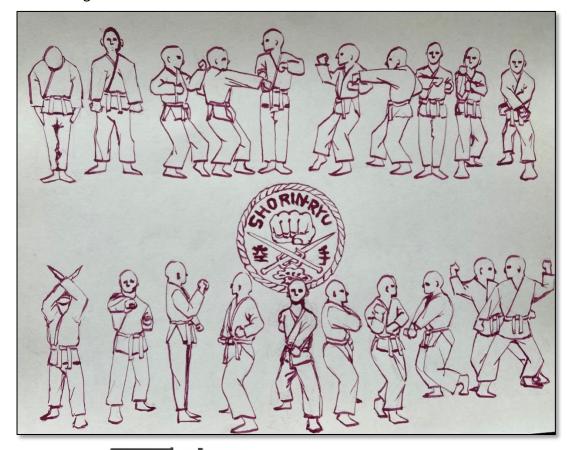

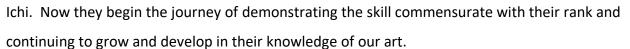
New Club Opened!

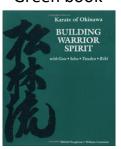

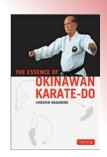
