It seems only a short time ago I traveled to the Republic of Panama with the U.S. military. On the Lord's Day I found myself at the Balboa Church of Christ preaching my first sermon in Panama. Little did I know where this ministry would go and the lives it has touched over the past 42 years. It was July of 1984 when I arrived in this country that would touch my heart and the heart of my family in ways we did not expect. It also touched countless others causing most of us to return time and time again. I truly do not regret the many flights, the many miles up and down rivers and traveling through different parts of the jungle of Panama carrying the gospel to these sweet people. In 2011 a clinic was built in the Darien province, named, "Clinic of Hope" and has helped thousands of people with better health. We have a memory board with pictures of those who served in Panama and now have passed on for hundreds who have served.

However, the greatest joy was the hundreds of people that have put on Christ through being baptized. Five different congregations of the Lord's church were established, and several others were strengthened and began to grow, all because so many Christians gave their vacation time and their money to serve others. We have been part of many precious souls who turned from the old way of living and were baptized. What a joy that has been. Again, I do not regret all the

miles that I have traveled in this ministry. I am so thankful for the hundreds that have travelled to this beautiful part of the world to change lives for Jesus Christ.



Our September Medical team has a new face with Shron French who is employed with Southern Smiles in Millbrook, Alabama, Dr. Stephen Scott. She examined the teeth of children while encouraging them to keep them clean and how best to care for their teeth. She went to each class at the Sanson elementary school with a smile and a stuffed animal checking their teeth. She has plans to return this coming June.



Many years ago, I can't remember how many, Doctor Russ Burcham, ophthalmologist called me, desiring to travel to Panama to help restore the sight to the blind. His comment to me was, *"I want to use the talent God has given me to help others."* True to his word, he and his wonderful wife Vicki, have made many trips to this beautiful part of the world to make a difference in the lives of others taking with their dedicated support personnel. Water filtration

“Approximately 2 billion people lack access to safely managed drinking water. Over 785 million people do not have basic drinking water services. Many communities rely on contaminated sources, increasing health risks. Water scarcity affects more than 40% of people worldwide.” World Health Organization.

It was in 2010 when I first discovered that many people in Panama do not have safe drinking water. Since that time hundreds of people have joined me in making contributions to help bring safe drinking water by using the Sawyer water filter system. The late doctor Joe Wilhite said, *“If people could only have clean water, it would change their health a hundredfold.* To answer the questions of many, *“do we still distribute these filters.” The answer is yes. Operation Christmas Joy 2025 was a great success with Christmas gifts being delivered all over the country of Panama. Churches and individuals from many locations both far and wide delivered their gifts to Montgomery. The container was loaded and arrived in Panama bringing joy to thousands of children. He received a specially designed wheelchair that makes his life easier.
