This province joins Columbia and is the home to the Embera and Wonan Indian people of which I have built a wonderful relationship. I have preached in their villages and baptized a number of these sweet people.

As the years passed others began to join us traveling several times a year for the purpose of teaching, Preaching and conducting medical attention to thousands of people. We have had the privilege from one end of Panama to the other preaching the gospel and serving through our humanitarian efforts. God is good and provided wonderful Christians to travel and serve. Several



congregations of the Lord's church have been established through our medical missions.

Mission work can never happen without the support of churches and many individual Christians. We have received support from all over the country thus we have been able to make a difference in the lives of thousands of people. Thank you all for being part of this ministry over the years.

Diane Edrington reports: Panama Mission medical team was honored and privileged to collaborate with the Elite Senafront Border services for this year's medical event in the Darien province of Panama.

General Jorge Gobea, Director of Senafront coordinated the event, Colonel Leonel Espinosa supervised and the special forces team assisted our team in providing security, interpreters and medical assistance.



This amazing work force gave us the opportunity to provide health care to villages deeper in the rainforest that have very little if any access to health care. Each day we loaded up Senafront trucks and jeeps to start the 3 to 4 hour journey in the Darien jungle. We treated 1,063 patients. Many illnesses were treated including several cases of malaria. Providing healthcare to those in need is one thing but caring for those in need is another. I would walk around the open areas while our

team was treating patients and to see the look on faces of hope and gratitude that someone cares. God has blessed Panama Missions with many opportunities to reach out to those who need us the most and this event was no exception. My favorite phrase that describes each mission trip is "If no one knows I exist then no one knows I live" Panama Mission team knows they exist and with the Lord's blessings we will continue to help because we know they live......

Report of surgical team for 2024

For the 24th year Dr. Russ Burcham from Denver, Colorado has led a medical group into Panama which has changed the lives of thousands of people who otherwise would have remained blind. January and February of 2024 they operated on 236 people. People from all over Panama made the trip to Torti, Panama for surgery. Through the efforts of Doctor Burcham three congregations have been established. These three churches are thriving, and the gospel

is being proclaimed to the lost. The need is so great the Dr. Burcham has decided to bring his team back to Panama for an October campaign in Chiriqui, Panama located toward the Costa Rica border. He and his team demonstrate the love and compassion of Jesus letting people know God loves them.

Also traveling with this team is a group of general medicine nurses and doctors taking care of medical needs. Over 800 people were examined and received treatment.

Clinic of Hope turned the lights on April 11, 2009, and stands as a symbol throughout the Darien Province of the love, compassion and dedication of many committed Christians who have worked and stayed at the clinic. Because of the talents of people like Bill Watts, Allen Gunn, David Brady and many others this building continues to give

hope to people who cannot

travel to Panama City for medical treatment nor have the resources to obtain medications. Where we can't help with major illnesses there are many things that can and have been accomplished, such as a baby who was found to have a serious heart defect and was transported to the Childrens hospital in Panama City where he had open heart surgery. Also, hundreds



of pap tests have been performed with one lady testing positive for cancer. *Yes, it brings hope when there is no hope*. Teams go down from time to time to perform maintenance on the building. Thanks to so many who have made this possible.

Operation Christmas Joy has completed our 27th year with churches and individuals from many states making gifts along with sewing clubs sewing beautiful clothes for the children. Thousands of gifts are given out each year along with backpacks for school age children.
