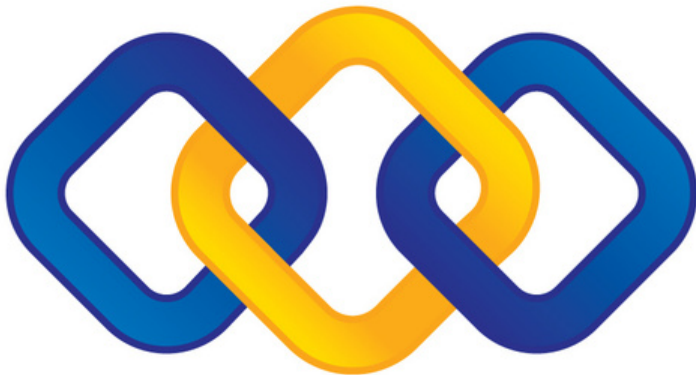
7,500
