We would love for you to attend and show your support. Even if you do not want to speak but wish to have your position on this initiative known, we will supply small paddles you can just hold up when you are asked to introduce yourself in the Meet and Greet at the start of the meeting.

During the Public Participation section, Gwenn Graboyes will be sharing information about the Protect Clark Lake initiative for community education and engagement, addressing updates on the state and municipal levels, and proposing an option for the ordinance restricting artificially enhanced wake boats on Clark Lake. If anyone else wishes to speak, they are more than welcome.

The public comment period is near the top of the agenda, so please arrive by 7:00 PM.

Simply being present sends a powerful message that Clark Lake residents and supporters care deeply about protecting the lake.

If you can join us, it will make a difference. You do not need to stay for the entire meeting.

Yard Signs

We now have more than 70 yard signs posted throughout the area, including Downtown Sturgeon Bay, Bailey's Harbor, Bayshore Drive in Sevastopol, Jacksonport, and around much of Clark Lake itself. Thank you to everyone who has displayed a sign. We are down to just a few remaining signs and may need to order another batch soon. Larger signs will also be appearing soon along Highway 57, WD, and Townline Road.

One note for residents on West Shore Drive: someone, who is apparently not supportive of our effort, has been removing signs. We have been able to recover and repost most of them. Please check your sign occasionally and let us know if you notice one missing.
