

An Angel Amongst Us

Guyla Clayton wasn't just a long-term resident of Leona Valley. Some referred to her as one of the heartbeats of our community. Guyla and Richard Rowland moved to Leona Valley in 1976 with their 2-year-old son David. Soon after, Sarah was born. A few years after Richard's untimely passing, Guyla married Max Clayton, who would become the husband and father the kids would know and love for most of their lives. Sadly, Guyla left us too early last December.

Guyla was an amazing person. She literally lived to help others. When Leona Valley friends or acquaintances were experiencing health crises, she would often step in to help. The kids remember many families being invited to stay in their home over the years to help weather health or other issues. Guyla was an extremely welcoming person. Many new residents, and/or members of her church would recall that it was Guyla who would be the first to reach out to make them feel like they belonged in the community.

She regularly would volunteer to be the driver for the elderly needing to get to church, as well as for those in need of transportation to hospitals or doctor's appointments. Guyla started a grocery fund for one particular elderly woman, though most did not know she was doing it. Guyla wasn't in it for the praise or the notoriety. It's what she did. She was always ready to volunteer for our local organizations and was a tremendous help.

Guyla would periodically volunteer to join missionary visits to other countries, helping in any way that she could. She volunteered in the children's nursery at church, and hosted Women's Teas. For over 20 years, Guyla hosted a Sunrise Easter Service at her home. You always wanted to be in Guyla's orbit. She was interesting, she was compassionate, and she would always be your friend.

Guyla will be remembered for her effervescent smile, and her infectious positive attitude. She'll be remembered as a shining star of our Valley that constantly and selflessly gave to her community and residents in need. It was her passion to always help others when they needed it most. Guyla was one of Leona Valley's true angels. She herself would likely say that she has now "gained her eternal crown". She will be greatly missed, but she's now at peace.

Cherry Parade and Festival Changes on the Way

You spoke. We listened. After last year's successful Cherry Parade and Festival, the LVIA Board placed suggestion boxes in local businesses for a month. We collected everything that you liked about the parade/festival, and ideas for how we could make things better for 2025. Here's where we are as of February;

- 1. Bring the community building activities and vendors to the main intersection where most of the parade action and spectators are (*We are making it happen*)
- 2. Add shuttle service from Community Building to main intersection and back (*We're currently looking for pay options, but are open to any ideas from the community*)
- 3. Pick up trash on Leona Avenue after parade (*Plan in place*)
- 4. Improve parking for spectators and festival-goers (*Multiple actions underway*)
- 5. Expand sound from announcer flatbed to reach farther south on 90th, and looking toward Don Chato parking lot (Adding speakers and cable where needed)
- 6. Improve sign-in logistics for parade participants (*Actions underway*)
- 7. Improve judging experience and be able to judge entrants while in motion (*Judging will be done in real-time, located near main intersection*)
- 8. Add more musical-themed parade entries (Working on it and open to ideas)
- 9. Add more horse entries (We do need the community to submit more horse related entries)
- 10. Increase speed of food prep (New deep-fryer purchased for cherry burritos. Large BBQ will be used for burgers in new location)

There are some other smaller actions that are also being worked on per community suggestions, but the 10 actions above are the main ones. Thanks for the feedback, and as always, please consider volunteering for any amount of time available on parade/festival day (June 7th). We would greatly appreciate assistance on the biggest day of the year in Leona Valley. You don't have to work the whole day. We'll take you in one-hour increments if that works best for you. Let's keep making it better every year!

During his years with LVIA, he brought his management skills to bear in creating better organization and procedures, as well as upgrades to the Community Building.

Rich and Mary were always happy to open their beautiful home, with its extensive collection of antiques, to host fund-raising events for our community organizations. They were great hosts, and Rich especially loved showing off his antique player pianos and cars. He had a wealth of knowledge of almost everything and was happy to consult on any topic. Valley With A View By Jeff Wright

In 1967, John and Dee Cosola moved their family of young children to a hidden, scenic valley where other firemen had been moving with their families. They found what so many others have since discovered; a tranquil rural environment, full of wonderful neighbors and a heavenly dose of nature. Their first home was on 98th Street, but they later would build their dream home up on the north side of ELR, looking at Bouquet Canyon disappearing south into the distance. Besides the spectacular sunrises and sunsets that their new view afforded them, they also were able to take in the wonderful expanse of Leona Valley's south side.

Siblings Frank, Gina, and JoDee Cosola grew up in Leona Valley, also enjoying the lifestyle and the incredible country views with their parents for many years. A particular favorite view of their mom's was the old Juan Arrache Ranch area, a half-mile down Bouquet from ELR. The old barn and silo have been the subject of many photos and countless head-turnings by those driving the Bouquet Canyon route. The property had been vacant for some years when Dee heard a rumor that the barn was going to be torn down. Her view would be forever changed.

Daughter Gina had become an accomplished artist over the previous decade and decided to produce an acrylic painting of that barn and silo scene. Working from a photograph, Gina finished the work not long before the barn was indeed torn down. It would become a beautiful and treasured gift from daughter to mother.

Now in their late-80s and early-90s, John and Dee have downsized and moved to Temecula. Gina and JoDee have gotten married and also moved out of the area. Frank and his wife Susan still live in their beautiful LV home high up on the north side with their own spectacular view of the same south hills. Recently, Dee and John decided that to honor the valley in which they had spent so many memorable years, they wanted to donate the gorgeous painting to the West Antelope Valley Historical Society, to eventually be displayed as art in the old LV school house. Leona Valley is grateful for the donation and is appreciative of Gina's artistic talents.
